Q13 News: South King County seeing spike in COVID-19 cases

Our news partner Q13 News is reporting that higher positive rates of COVID-19 are being reported in south King County

Q13 News is tracking the local hotspots of coronavirus.

Communities in South King County are experiencing a higher percentage of tests coming back positive for COVID-19.

Inside Designing Diva's Hair Salon, Vivian Bentley feels like she's at war with the monster virus.

"Really washing down everything I touch, everything my client touches," Bentley said.

But no amount of cleaning can make her feel 100% safe.

"It's one of those lingering thoughts in your head, I hope I don't get it today," Bentley said.

Bentley is closely following the data that shows her city of Burien and other South King County areas seeing the highest percentage of positive cases of COVID-19.

It doesn't necessarily mean there are more deaths but it does mean there is a higher level of the virus looming in those communities.

For example South Auburn is seeing a 12% positivity rate.

Other jurisdictions in South King County with high rates include Kent, SeaTac, Tukwila, Federal Way and North Highline. At least one in 10 people in those areas who got tested for the virus received a positive result.

White Center and Burien are also seeing spikes. "People listen to the science, do what the science says," Bentley said.

Data shows African Americans, Hispanics and Pacific Islanders are disproportionately impacted with hospitalizations significantly higher than whites or Asians.

"Petrified because I can bring it home, I am taking care of my 73-year-old mother," Bentley said. Bentley says she wishes she didn't have to work since her job requires contact. But she has no choice.

"Somebody's got to pay the bills," Bentley said. COVID-19 is underscoring glaring inequities.

Health experts say more low-income people live in South King County and work in service jobs.

In less affluent communities, there are fewer resources and access to healthy foods as well as inadequate healthcare. Those factors can often become

the root of underlying health conditions.

Bentley says in the black community, multigenerational families often live under the same roof in order to afford rent.

"A lot of communities live together," Bentley said.

That allows the virus to spread more.

It's going to get worse before it gets better, hopefully, we can bridge the gap," Bentley said.

Bentley says although the data is scary, it is also vital because it keeps people aware. It also sheds light on where leaders need to focus their energy.

The Burien business owner says last week's mask giveaway in South King County was a good effort but she hopes those events would be more frequent.

She also says cities need to provide more information on grants and loans for businesses to stay afloat.

The purpose of this public hearing was to consider adoption of Proposed Ordinance 2019-0413 (Ordinance 19146) an ordinance adopting 2020 amendments to the 2016 King County Comprehensive Plan (Comprehensive Plan), and as amended in 2017 and 2018, including the proposed adoption of the Skyway-West Hill Land Use Strategy as an amendment to, and element of, the Comprehensive Plan. The Council then adopted this Ordinance at the Friday, July 24, 2020 meeting.

SUMMARY: The Comprehensive Plan is the guiding policy document for all land use and development regulations in unincorporated King County, and for such countywide regional services as transit, solid waste, wastewater treatment, parks, trails, and open space. The Comprehensive Plan is required by the state Growth Management Act. Proposed updates to the King County Comprehensive Plan were transmitted by the King County Executive on September 30, 2019. Briefings were held in the Mobility and Environment Committee between October 2019 and February 2020. Council action took place on July 24, 2020.

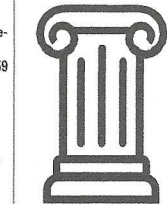

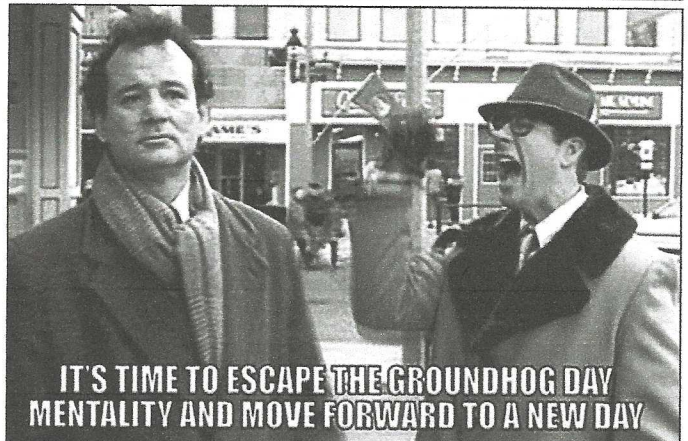

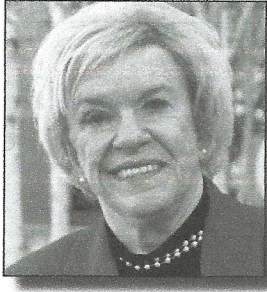

Step-by-step during the pandemic

When President Trump sidestepped and decided to delegate the pandemic response to the states, governors across the country were left calling their own shots. Some governors rose to the occasion and acted wisely; others not so much. An analysis by a team of national reporters singled out the three U.S. states that initially did the best job: Vermont, Louisiana and Washington. That's right, our state was one of the top three, best at containing the COVID-19 outbreak. Vermont scored Number One. That state, which had the benefit of a mainly rural geography, had the fewest deaths per capita (nine per 100,000 residents). Vermont's Republican governor, Phil Scott, teamed with a Democratic-led legislature to impose an early mask mandate and invest in testing and tracing.

For its part, Washington was ranked Number Two with 29 deaths per 100,000 residents—a tragic loss, but far less than in most other states. Although presented with the nation's first reported COVID-19 case and an outbreak in nursing homes, Washington still managed to set an example. Gov. Jay Inslee relied on health experts to lead in messaging and guiding state response. Nine months after the first coronavirus case, this state's per capita death toll was less than 1/16th that of New York's.

Inslee and his team were helped along by extensive data sharing, something spurred by researchers at the University of Washington. Those are the folks who make the national news with their professional number crunching. Knowing what's going on really matters.

Early on, this state's leaders recognized the need to protect elderly and vulnerable people living in nursing facilities. When Washington received a \$6.2 million bump in federal Medicare funds, the governor directed the money to nursing homes. That grant helped add staff and equipment and provided hazard pay for some workers.

One of the secrets to Washington's success in managing the crisis is Inslee's "Safe Start Washington" plan. The governor using a four-phased approach, reopening counties a stage at a time. As its infection levels improve, counties can apply to move to a less restrictive stage.

All the state's 39 counties have now progressed beyond Phase One. The lowest step had high-risk people advised to stay home, but did allow drive-in spiritual services and the reopening of curbside retail and some essential businesses.

Most counties such as King County are now in a modified Phase Two, which permits outdoor recreation involving up to five people, as well as hair salons, barbers

and restaurants with 50 percent capacity and no more than six diners per table.

The governor's phased steps keep getting more permissive with Phase Three allowing libraries, movie theaters and museums to reopen. But a county has to really show decreased incidence of virus before moving into Phase Four which reopens nightclubs, concert venues and large sporting events.

The phased approach sounds bureaucratic and there are many who chafe at the governor's tactics. Inslee has been sued more than once, he's seen armed demonstrators and had heaps of criticism. He has acquired a general election opponent, Sheriff Loren Culp of Republic (population 1,100), who refuses to go along with the governor's mask mandate and rails against Inslee's COVID-19 rules as "a violation of rights." Culp also refuses to enforce 1639, the voter-approved gun control initiative.

During the election, voters will decide whether to continue to follow Washington's science-directed approach to the pandemic. When deciding, voters need to consider the alternatives, states where governors have rushed to reopen bars, beaches and gathering places. Steeply rising infection rates in those states are scary.

In our state, too, we're seeing numbers increase during a Fall Surge, not good news and more reason than ever to take precautions. Until a vaccine can control the outbreak, it's best to stick within the rules, mask up and keep our friends and loved ones safe until we can all (more than five) party together again.
