I subscribe to the Best Start for Kids Monthly News and Highlights, and the CYAB opportunity was sent out on the Tuesday 10/29/19 issue. I also discussed the opportunity with Janet Cady, the Associate Chief Medical Officer for Neighborcare Health, who was one of the founding members of the CYAB. She shared the highlights of her experience with me, and encouraged me to apply.

In King County, equity is fundamental to the society we wish to build. Our end goal is for full and equal access to opportunities, power, and resources so that all people may achieve their full potential. The Children and Youth Advisory Board incorporates these values and has adopted its own equity statement. The CYAB works to build an inclusive board that includes the voices of underrepresented populations, people of color, immigrants and refugees, LGBTQ individuals, low-income households, youth, the elderly, rural residents, people living with disabilities and more. Please describe your experience with and/or commitment to promoting equity. What opportunities do you see for the CYAB to incorporate the voice of all communities in King County?
I am searching for leadership positions in King County that provide me with opportunities to help dismantle institutionalized racism. As a Queer Latina living in Seattle, I am challenging myself to take more responsibility for using my voice to enact equity and social justice in my communities. I continue to attend anti-racism trainings and workshops, but I am ready to begin working for what I believe in, because just believing in equity is not enough. The same is true when considering how the CYAB can incorporate all the voices in King County. A room full of leaders who are educated in the concept of equity is only the first step. Leaders should understanding that the possibility of discomfort, and even redistribution of power applies to them, not just the community they are trying to make more equitable. Effective community outreach is key, with relationship-building at its center. This means choosing phone calls and in-person meetings over emails, dedicating significant time and patience to build trust with grassroots organizations, and removing barriers that prevent underrepresented folks from sharing their input.
