Pro-rated Fee Proposal

65 staff members

Program is fully fee for service

Proposal to allow for quarterly pro-rated fee schedule for new applicants

Current

Bi-annual pro-rated fee schedule:

April 1 - September 30 (100%), October 1 - March 31 (50%).



Proposed

Quarterly schedule:

April 1 - June 30 (100%), July 1 - September 30 (75%), October 1 - December 31 (50%), January 1 - March 31 (25%).

Quarterly pro-rated fee model balances customer desire without negatively impacting administrative resources.

Benefits of quarterly pro-rated fees

- Retail food establishments including restaurants, grocery stores, deli's, coffee shops, caterers, and mobile food units.
- New applicants applying in the second and fourth quarters benefit from an additional 25% savings.
- This applies to first-time applicants
 (~450 new food businesses per year).
- Proposed savings range from \$101 \$310 per quarter
 (Q 2-4) per permit, based on risk/seating categories.



COMPARISON FEE STRUCTURE

Example: Risk level 3 food establishment with seating at 50-150	CURRENTLY BI-ANNUAL	PROPOSED QUARTERLY
April 1 - June 30, 2023 (100%)	\$1,012	\$1,012
July 1 - September 30, 2023 (75%)	\$1,012	\$759
October 1 - December 31, 2023(50%)	\$506	\$506
Jan 1 - March 31, 2024 (25%)	\$506	\$253



Minimize financial burden for applicants

- Informal survey during quarterly stakeholder meetings.
- Surveys to garner opinions from stakeholders.

- Formal 3-question survey sent to retail food establishments (293 responded)
- Q 1. Support the pro-rated fee proposal? (yes, 86%)
- Q2. Would you have saved money under a pro-rated fee structure? (yes, 72%)
- Q 3. Is the pro-rated fee structure proposal fair? (yes, 86%,)

Quarterly pro-ration is a common practice among other local/national health jurisdictions
