3. Remote attendance at the meeting by phone or computer: You may provide oral comment on current agenda items during the meeting's public comment period by connecting to the meeting via phone or computer using the ZOOM application at https:\\zoom.us\, and entering the webinar ID number below.

#### 12. Proposed Ordinance No. 2022-0386

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of one or more series of limited tax general obligation bonds of the county in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$625,000,000 to provide financing for management system upgrades, open space acquisitions, affordable housing and housing for the homeless, transit-oriented development, climate equity projects, renewable energy and energy demand reduction projects, farmland infrastructure, electric vehicle charging infrastructure, capital improvements to the Harborview Medical Center and Maleng Regional Justice Center, the acquisition of land adjacent to the county airport, solid waste system capital improvements, emergency response, community facilities and participatory budgeting projects, and to pay the costs of issuing the bonds; authorizing the issuance and sale of one or more series of limited tax general obligation refunding bonds to refund outstanding limited tax general obligations of the county and to pay the costs of issuing the bonds; establishing funds for the receipt and expenditure of bond proceeds and for the payment of the bonds; and providing for the annual levy of taxes to pay the principal thereof and interest thereon.
