In this meeting only the rules and procedures applicable to committees apply and not those applicable to full council meetings.

There are two ways to provide public comment:

If your comments are submitted before 8:30 a.m. on the day of the Law and Justice Committee meeting, your comments will be distributed to the committee members and appropriate staff prior to the meeting.
