1 **STRIKING AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED MOTION 2021-0467, VERSION 2**

2 On page 1, beginning on line 3, strike everything through page 7, line 127, and insert:

3 "WHEREAS, King County is committed to creating a racially and socially just
4 county for all residents, and

5 WHEREAS, historic structural racism and disenfranchisement have suppressed
6 access for marginalized populations, including communities of color, to economic, health
7 and environmental opportunities to reach their full potential and thrive, and

8 WHEREAS, laws and policies at every level of government, such as alien land
9 laws passed in Washington state between 1886 and 1923 and racially restrictive
10 covenants, were racially discriminatory and prevented Black, Indigenous and people of
11 color ("BIPOC") populations from attaining homeownership and achieving generational
12 wealth, and

13 WHEREAS, there are persistent inequities by race, ethnicity and place for many
14 communities that hinder access to early childhood development, quality education, parks
15 and open space, community spaces, culturally relevant businesses, affordable housing,
16 healthcare and human services, and

17 WHEREAS, the double-digit increase in housing prices in King County year-
18 over-year and the loss of 112,000 units of housing affordable to those making 80 percent

19 area median income or less since 2012 has led to increasing unaffordability and
20 ultimately displacement of low-income families and communities of color, and

21 WHEREAS, equitable development refers to public and private investments,
22 programs and policies in geographic areas that take into account past history and current
23 conditions to meet the needs of marginalized populations and to reduce disparities so that
24 quality of life outcomes are equitably distributed for both existing residents and new
25 residents to create strong communities, and

26 WHEREAS, inequities in community investment perpetuate disparate outcomes
27 and displacement for historically marginalized populations including BIPOC, immigrants
28 and refugees, LGBTQ and persons with disabilities, and

29 WHEREAS, the council seeks to directly address negative impacts caused by
30 historical structural racism, disenfranchisement and inequities in community investment,
31 and

32 WHEREAS, the council unanimously adopted Ordinance 16948, which is also
33 referred to as the Equity and Social Justice Ordinance, in 2010, reaffirming a shared
34 vision in which all King County residents have equitable opportunity to thrive, defining
35 equity for the county and identifying determinants of equity and priorities for government
36 in advancing equity, and

37 WHEREAS, the 2016-2022 King County Equity and Social Justice Strategic Plan
38 establishes a blueprint for action and change aimed at expanding access to opportunities
39 in eight areas, including: child and youth development; economic development and jobs;
40 environment and climate; health and human services; housing; information and
41 technology; the justice system; and transportation and mobility, and

42 WHEREAS, dedicated place-based funding to advance these eight opportunity
43 areas, along with community partnerships, is critical to advance and implement racial and
44 social equity in King County, and

45 WHEREAS, an equitable development initiative provides investment, programs
46 and policies that take into account past policy decisions, historic inequities and current
47 conditions that will improve access to opportunities to the most affected communities and
48 allocate resources to communities at risk from displacement, and

49 WHEREAS, an equitable development initiative includes investment and resource
50 allocation to identified communities to advance economic mobility and opportunity,
51 prevent residential, economic and cultural displacement, build upon local cultural assets,
52 promote transportation mobility and connectivity, create healthy and safe communities,
53 and enable equitable access for all communities;

54 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

55 A.1. The council requests that the executive establish an equitable development
56 initiative.

57 2. Planning and creation of the initiative shall be completed in partnership with a
58 planning workgroup comprised of community membership emphasizing Black,
59 Indigenous and people of color leadership and broad geographic representation, including
60 unincorporated King County, who are appointed by the executive in consultation with the
61 council using an open application process. Consideration should be given to individuals
62 with lived experience or expertise relevant to the initiative. Appointees shall be
63 compensated for their participation.

64 3. The initiative shall be countywide in scope. The planning workgroup is
65 requested to make recommendations to the executive and council regarding how to
66 prioritize the initiative's work in unincorporated area communities, particularly
67 historically marginalized communities, consistent with King County's responsibility as
68 the unincorporated local government.

69 4. The initiative should be guided by a framework with the following principles:
70 a. advances economic mobility and opportunity for residents;
71 b. prevents residential, commercial and cultural displacement;
72 c. builds upon and protects local cultural assets that anchor communities;
73 d. supports organizational capacity building;
74 e. promotes transportation mobility and connectivity; and
75 f. enables equitable access for all communities.

76 B. Any new focus or framework principles adopted by this motion shall not apply
77 to the Best Starts Capital Grants Program. If the initiative is adopted and implemented,
78 the Best Starts Capital Grants Program would be informed by and made collaboratively
79 with the initiative, consistent with the Best Starts for Kids implementation plan. The
80 council requests the workgroup and executive propose recommendations for coordination
81 between the initiative and the Best Starts Capital Grants Program.

82 C. The council requests that the executive transmit phase 1 of an equitable
83 development initiative implementation plan created with the planning workgroup
84 identified in section A. of this motion. Phase 1 of the plan should include, but is not
85 limited to, the following:

86 1. A framework that is consistent with equitable community-driven
87 development principles identified in section A. of this motion;

88 2. Recommendations and next steps for county and community structure,
89 capacity and related resources necessary to support an equitable development initiative,
90 informed by similar programs.

91 D. The council further requests that the executive transmit phase 2 of the
92 equitable development initiative implementation plan created in partnership with the
93 planning workgroup identified in section A. of this motion. Phase 2 of the plan should:

94 1. Include objectives and strategies for reducing economic and racial disparities,
95 by preventing residential, economic and cultural displacement and creating and
96 preserving community stability;

97 2. Incorporate data of current and predicted future displacement risk and related
98 metrics that should be used to determine programs and policies;

99 3. Include metrics for monitoring and evaluating equitable outcomes;

100 4. Describe potential partnerships with community-based organizations,
101 regional partners and other jurisdictions to establish the initiative program funding and
102 policies countywide;

103 5. Identify new potential funding sources or existing funding sources that could
104 be repurposed to leverage and support anti-displacement efforts, including community-
105 driven place-based or cultural investment that advances the initiative;

106 6. Propose strategies to coordinate across county agencies and programs to

- 116 10. Include a recommendation for a permanent advisory board to implement the
117 initiative, including determining policy and funding decisions regarding equitable
118 development. The recommendation should include a proposal for board composition and
119 membership with an emphasis on Black, Indigenous and people of color leadership,
120 broad geographic representation including unincorporated King County and those with
121 lived experience, with expertise or who are most impacted by displacement pressures.
122 The recommendation should also propose an open application process and board
123 compensation for participation.

125 August 31, 2022, with the clerk of the council, who shall retain an electronic copy and
126 provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers, the council chief of staff and the lead

- 128 F. The executive should electronically file phase 2 of the plan, as well as any
129 necessary legislation to establish the equitable development initiative, no later than June
130 30, 2023, with the clerk of the council, who shall retain an electronic copy and provide an

131 electronic copy to all councilmembers, the council chief of staff and the lead staff for the
132 committee of the whole, or its successor. The plan should be accompanied by a proposed
133 motion that should accept the plan."

- 136 - **Revise the planning workgroup composition regarding geographic**
137 **representation to specify unincorporated King County.**
- 138 - **State that the Best Starts Capital Grants Program would be informed and**
139 **made collaboratively with the initiative, consistent with the BSK**
140 **implementation plan. Requests that the workgroup and Executive propose**
141 **recommendations for coordination between the programs.**
- 142 - **Revises a plan requirement regarding identifying funding sources to include**
143 **new potential funding sources and existing funding sources that could be**
144 **repurposed to advance the initiative.**
- 145 - **Revises the permanent advisory board recommendation to include**
146 **determining policy and funding decisions. Revises the permanent advisory**
147 **board composition to emphasize BIPOC leadership, broad geographic**
148 **representation including unincorporated King County, those with lived**
149 **experience, expertise or who are most impacted by displacement pressure.**
150 **Specifies that the recommendation should include an open application**
151 **process.**
