## STRIKING AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED MOTION 2021-0467, VERSION 2

2 On page 1, beginning on line 3, strike everything through page 7, line 127, and insert:

"WHEREAS, King County is committed to creating a racially and socially just

county for all residents, and

5 WHEREAS, historic structural racism and disenfranchisement have suppressed

access for marginalized populations, including communities of color, to economic, health

and environmental opportunities to reach their full potential and thrive, and

8 WHEREAS, laws and policies at every level of government, such as alien land

over-year and the loss of 112,000 units of housing affordable to those making 80 percent

## EFFECT prepared by *J Ngo*: Striking Amendment 1 would:

- Revise the planning workgroup composition regarding geographic representation to specify unincorporated King County.
- State that the Best Starts Capital Grants Program would be informed and made collaboratively with the initiative, consistent with the BSK implementation plan. Requests that the workgroup and Executive propose recommendations for coordination between the programs.
  - Revises a plan requirement regarding identifying funding sources to include new potential funding sources and existing funding sources that could be repurposed to advance the initiative.
  - Revises the permanent advisory board recommendation to include determining policy and funding decisions. Revises the permanent advisory board composition to emphasize BIPOC leadership, broad geographic representation including unincorporated King County, those with lived experience, expertise or who are most impacted by displacement pressure. Specifies that the recommendation should include an open application process.
  - Changes the committee from the mobility and environment committee to the committee of the whole.
