2 Beginning on page 1, strike lines 13 through 19, and insert:

3 "WHEREAS, the Metro transit department is committed to becoming an antiracist

4 mobility agency, a goal the council strongly endorses, and

5 WHEREAS, the proviso requirement that the Metro transit department undertake

6 a transit safety, security and fare enforcement reform initiative was made in 2020, during

the early months of the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic, when safety and security

reforms were presumed to be based upon a system operating at full capacity, and

WHEREAS, safety and security conditions have changed and ridership has

11 WHEREAS, the needs of the transit system will continue to change, and

12 WHEREAS, in response to the proviso requirement, the Metro transit department

13 prepared the safety, security and fare enforcement reform initiative implementation

36	effort was initiated several years ago when transit safety and security concerns were
37	different than today and that the Council's action of approving the Safety, Security,
38	and Fare Enforcement (SaFE) Reform Initiative Implementation Report indicates
39	the Council's concurrence that Metro has satisfied the budget proviso requirement
40	but does not indicate support for any specific recommendations in the report and

- does not provide the authority for changes to transit policy. The amendment 41
