Program Overview

Goal: to deliver projects that help restore the natural functions of rivers and the benefits they provide to our communities, including:

- Providing or restoring public access to the water
- Improving the ecological functions of a waterbody
- Increasing public awareness of river corridors as valuable natural resources

Awards of up to \$1M per project including:

- Land Acquisition
- Capital Projects (Feasibility, Design, Preconstruction, Construction)
- Outreach and education related to project















Seattle Public Utilities (District 9)
