Dear Councilmember Balducci:

As required by Ordinance 18628, this letter transmits a report documenting the efforts taken to continue protecting water quality in our region in response to the West Point Treatment Plant (West Point) flood event that occurred on February 9, 2017.

The report provides a second quarter 2022 update of the implementation plan for the recommendations provided by AECOM. Additionally, the six corrective actions required by the Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) noted in the Ordinance are considered complete as of the 2018 fourth quarter report transmitted in February 2019.

The report addresses updates made since the 2022 first quarter report that was submitted in May 2022. In response to the first requirement of implementing a life safety management system (LSM), in-person LSM training concluded in May 2022. Online video training will be available to employees starting in Q3 2022.

During Q2 2022, WTD completed the recruitment process for the 2022 Operator in Training (OIT) program. This process resulted in the selection and hire of 20 OIT positions, which is an increase of six positions from 2021.

This report furthers the King County Strategic Plan goal of efficient, accountable regional and local government by providing an open and transparent update on the implementation of AECOM's recommendations to enhance employee safety and protect the region's investments at West Point. The report also furthers the Strategic Climate Action Plan goal of preparing for climate change by providing information on preparing West Point to handle the effects of increasingly severe storms.

In developing the report, the Department of Natural Resources and Parks provided updates on the implementation of the recommendations in the AECOM report to the Metropolitan Water Pollution Abatement Advisory Committee and the Regional Water Quality Committee.

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It is estimated that the report required seven staff hours to produce, costing approximately \$1,000. The estimated printing cost for this report is nominal.

Thank you for your consideration of this report. This report will help policymakers and the public understand how King County is improving systems at West Point and preparing to withstand or mitigate the impact of future storms.
