3	WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 86.15.140, the King County Flood Control Zone
4	District ("the District") held a public hearing on the proposed 2023 budget of the District
5	on November 8, 2022, and
6	WHEREAS, the board of supervisors ("the Board") desires to adopt the King
7	County Flood Control Zone District's 2023 budget, and
8	WHEREAS, by Ordinance 15728, the King County council adopted the District's
9	initial comprehensive plan of development for flood and stormwater control, which is
10	titled "2006 King County Flood Hazard Management Plan," and by Resolution
11	FCD2011-05.1, the District Board amended the initial plan to include a project in the city
12	of Seattle (collectively, "the District Comprehensive Plan"), and
13	WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 86.15.110, the Board must approve by resolution
14	all flood control and storm water control improvements, prior to the extension,
15	enlargement, acquisition or construction of such improvements, and
16	WHEREAS, RCW 85.15.110, further provides that such approval resolution must
17	state whether the improvements are to be extended, enlarged, acquired or constructed;
18	state that the comprehensive plan has been adopted; state that the improvements generally

19 contribute to the objectives of the comprehensive plan; state that the improvements will

- 20 benefit the county as a whole; state the estimated costs of the improvements; and identify
- 21 the data supporting the estimated costs, and
- 22 WHEREAS, the Board desires to approve improvements in the District's 2023
- 23 budget that are not in the District Comprehensive Plan, or that have been modified by the
- 24 District's 2023 budget, in accordance with RCW 85.15.110;
- 25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF

27 <u>SECTION 1.</u> The Board hereby adopts the 2023 Budget for the District, as set
28 forth in Attachments A ("Work Program"), B ("2023 Annual Budget"), C ("2023 Annual

29 Operating Budget"), D ("2023 Annual Capital Budget"), E ("2023 - 2028 Six-Year CIP"),

30 F ("2023 Annual District Oversight Budget"), G ("2023 Subregional Opportunity Fund

31 Allocations"), and H ("2023-2028 Six-Year CIP Project Allocations") to this resolution;

32 provided that King County, or other jurisdictions contracted to implement projects, shall

33 submit predesign reports for capital projects to the District executive director, and shall

34 seek approval from the executive director of project charters. Furthermore, King County

35 and other service providers as appropriate shall provide to the District executive director

36 thirty percent design project reports for authorization to proceed with sixty percent

37 design, sixty percent design project reports for authorization to proceed to ninety percent

38 design, and ninety percent design project reports for authorization to proceed to one

39 hundred percent design.

40 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The Board approves the extension, enlargement, acquisition, or
 41 construction, as applicable, of the improvements that are included in the District

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42	Comprehensive Plan, that are included in the District Comprehensive Plan but have been
43	modified by Attachments C, D, and H to this resolution, or that are not included in the
44	District Comprehensive Plan but are identified in Attachments C, D, and H to this
45	resolution (collectively, "the improvements"). The District Comprehensive Plan includes
46	the streams or water courses upon which the improvements will be enlarged, extended,
47	acquired, or constructed. The Board determines that the improvements generally
48	contribute to the objectives of the District Comprehensive Plan and will be of benefit to
49	the county as a whole.
50	SECTION 3. The estimated costs of the improvements are stated in Attachments
51	C, D, and H to this resolution and the supporting data for the estimated costs are on file
52	with the director of the King County water and land resources division.
53	SECTION 4. For the improvements that will be constructed, preliminary
54	engineering studies and plans either have been prepared or will be prepared, and have
55	been filed or will be filed, with the director of the King County water and land resources
56	division.
57	SECTION 5. The Board directs District executive director, District legal counsel,
58	and King County to work collaboratively to develop template grant contracts for the
59	contracts King County enters into as part of the administration of District grant programs.
60	The template grant contracts shall be submitted to the District for approval by March 31,

62	SECTION 6. The Board directs District executive director to work with King
63	County water and land resources division to provide a quarterly report on the progress of
64	the Sammamish River Capital Investment Strategy to interested stakeholders.

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65 SECTION 7. The Board directs the District executive director and King County 66 water and land resources division to provide regular updates to and seek the advice of the 67 members of the District Advisory Committee related to the update of the 2006 King 68 County Flood Hazard Management Plan. 69 SECTION 8. The Board directs the District executive director to provide 70 members of the District Advisory Committee regular reports on capital and financial 71 projections, including additional information on the "right-sizing" process for expenditure 72 projections for all District service providers. 73 SECTION 9. The Board directs King County water and land resources division to 74 provide a monthly report to the District executive director of the status of acquisitions of 75 property necessary to implement capital projects identified in Attachment H to this 76 resolution. 77 SECTION 10. The Board directs King County water and land resources division 78 to develop a workplan to begin implementing the recommended actions in the April 2022 79 Upper May Valley Drainage Study in 2023. The workplan shall be transmitted to the 80 District by February 28, 2023. 81 SECTION 11. The Board directs King County water and land resources division 82 to provide a report to the District on the best practices for asset management for all 83 facilities monitored and maintained by King County as service provider to the District. 84 SECTION 12. The Board directs King County water and land resources division 85 to provide a monthly report to the District executive director on the status of inspections 86 of all facilities monitored and maintained by King County as a service provider to the 87 District.

88 SECTION 13. The Board reiterates its commitment to educating residents of 89 King County about the dangers of dam failure and directs the District executive director 90 to continue to work with the King County office of emergency management on a dam 91 education and outreach program. The Board directs King County office of emergency 92 management to convert one temporary term limited position to a full time equivalent 93 position to support the District project delivery goals. 94 SECTION 14. The Board directs King County water and land resources division 95 to convert three temporary term limited positions to full time equivalent positions to 96 support District project delivery goals. 97 SECTION 15. The Board directs King County water and land resources division 98 to provide a monthly report to the executive director on the status of recruitment and 99 hiring of all vacant positions funded by the District. 100 SECTION 16. The Board directs the District executive director and King County 101 water and land resources division to work collaboratively to evaluate options to ensure 102 King County has the organizational capacity and structure to provide efficient and 103 effective implementation of the District's work program. 104 SECTION 17. The Board directs King County water and land resources division 105 to provide a quarterly report to the District executive director on the status of progress on 106 items in the Work Program as set forth in Attachment A to this resolution. 107 SECTION 18. Section 3.6 of the interlocal agreement between the District and 108 King County provides that King County shall notify the District executive director in 109 writing if the county needs to modify or reprioritize capital projects. King County's 110 notifications to the District executive director should include information regarding

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111 variations within project budgets of more than twenty percent in the "acquisition,"

112 "design," "construction," "contingency" and "total" expenditure categories, shown on113 Attachment D to this resolution.
