

We take a public health approach to preventing and eliminating gun violence



The Regional Approach to gun violence provides Intervention, Prevention and Restoration services



Services include incident and hospital based response, engagement and wrap-around care to those most impacted by gun violence and unjust systems

Identify and promote the conditions under which all people can live within healthy communities and can achieve optimum health.


Vision **for our workforce**
