## PRELIMINARY REPORT:

On May 2, the Department of Natural Resources and Parks (DNRP) submitted its report on file no. E22CT026 to the Examiner.

## PUBLIC HEARING:

After reviewing the preliminary report and examining available information on file with the application, the Examiner conducted a May 11, 2023, remote public hearing on the application. Participants at the public hearing and the exhibits offered and entered are listed in the attached minutes. A verbatim recording of the hearing is available in the Hearing Examiner's Office.

## FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS:

1. General Information:

- 2. The Applicants timely filed an application to King County for the Public Benefit Rating System (PBRS) program current use valuation of the property to begin in 2023. As required by law, notification of the application occurred.
- 3. A summary of relevant PBRS categories follows below. (Plain text represents a category an applicant requested an award for and that DNRP agrees is warranted. Any strikethrough represents a category an applicant requested an award for but that DNRP disagrees is warranted. Any *italics* represents a category an applicant did not request an award for, but that DNRP nonetheless concludes is warranted. And any \*asterisk\* represents a category where DNRP finds an award is warranted, but only if certain contingencies or conditions are met.)

The DNRP-recommended contingent score of 15 points results in a current use valuation of 40% of assessed value for the enrolled portion of the property.

- 4. The property is heavily impacted by a variety of noxious weeds. Enrollment in PBRS is contingent on submittal of a restoration plan by **October 31, 2023**, and DNRP approval of that plan by **December 31, 2023**.
- 5. If that contingency is satisfied, an additional five points may be awarded administratively under the limited public access (limited due to resource sensitivity) category, if multiple letters documenting present and future uses of the property by appropriate user groups and individuals is provided to DNRP by **December 31, 2023**.
- 6. As to the land area recommended for PBRS enrollment, the Applicant requested 3.50 acres and DNRP recommends 3.89 acres. (Enrollment acreage is the entire parcel less the excluded area, as calculated by DNRP. In the event the County Assessor's official parcel size is revised, the PBRS acreage shall be administratively adjusted.)
- 7. Except as modified herein, we find the facts set forth in DNRP's preliminary report and testimony at the May 11, 2023, public hearing correct and we incorporate them by reference. We will provide copies of this report and DNRP's report to the Metropolitan King County Council for final approval.
- 8. Contingent approval of 15 points and a current use valuation of 40% of assessed value for 3.89 acres, and contingent approval of five additional points and 30% of assessed value for those acres, are consistent with KCC Chapter 20.36 and with the purposes and intent of King County to maintain, preserve, conserve, and otherwise continue in existence adequate open space lands and to assure the use and enjoyment of natural resources and scenic beauty for the economic and social well-being of King County and its citizens.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

- APPROVE a current use valuation of 40% of assessed value for the 3.89-acre enrolled portion of the property, CONTINGENT on submittal of a restoration plan by October 31, 2023, and DNRP approval of that plan by December 31, 2023.
- 2. APPROVE an additional five points and a current use valuation of 30% of assessed value for the 3.89-acre enrolled portion of the property, CONTINGENT on submittal to DNRP, by **December 31, 2023**, of multiple letters documenting present and future uses of the property by appropriate user groups and individuals.

## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL

A person appeals an Examiner recommendation by following the steps described in KCC 20.22.230, including filing with the Clerk of the Council a sufficient appeal statement and a \$250 appeal fee (check payable to the King County FBOD). Appeal statements may refer only to facts contained in the hearing record; new facts may not be presented on appeal. KCC 20.22.230 also requires that the appellant provide copies of the appeal statement to the Examiner and to any named parties listed on the front page of the Examiner's recommendation.

Prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on *June 19, 2023,* an electronic copy of the appeal statement must be sent to <u>Clerk.Council@kingcounty.gov</u> and a paper copy of the appeal statement must be delivered to the Clerk of the Council's Office, Room 1200, King County Courthouse, 516 Third Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104. Prior mailing is not sufficient if actual receipt by the Clerk does not occur within the applicable time period. If the Office of the Clerk is not officially open on the specified closing date, delivery prior to the close of business on the next business day is sufficient to meet the filing requirement.

Unless both a timely and sufficient appeal statement and filing fee are filed by *June 19, 2023*, the Clerk of the Council shall place on the agenda of the next available Council meeting a proposed ordinance implementing the Examiner's recommended action. At that meeting the Council may adopt the Examiner's recommendation, defer action, refer the matter to a Council committee, or remand to the Examiner for further hearing or further consideration.

If a timely and sufficient appeal statement and filing fee are filed by *June 19, 2023*, the Examiner will notify all parties and interested persons and provide information about "next steps."

## ELECTRONIC RECORD AND SIGNATURE DISCLOSURE
