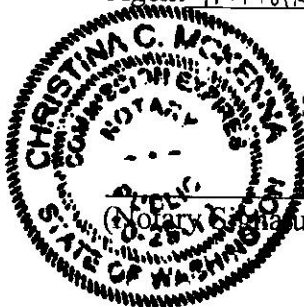

Proposed Ordinance 2012-0102**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Metropolitan King County Council (the Council) will hold a public hearing on the Council Chambers at the 10th floor of the King County Courthouse 1514 Third Avenue, Seattle, WA on Monday, November 26, 2012, beginning at 1:30 PM. The purpose of this public hearing is to consider adoption of Proposed Ordinance (PO) 2012-0102 (hereinafter, the "subject legislation") relating amendments to the 2008 King County Comprehensive Plan and to amend to 2012 KCCCP.

Public Hearing
King County encourages public comment at the November 26 public hearing. The hearing is limited to five minutes per speaker. If you require an interpreter for the Councilmembers' review, please arrive 15 minutes to the Council Clerk. The chambers are equipped with an audiovisual system capable of displaying overhead transparencies and oral presentations and computer displays. If you wish to utilize the audiovisual aids, please contact the King County Clerk's Office by November 15, 2012 or 206-296-1020 to advise them of your intent. Audiovisual presentations are included in the 2012-0102 legislative package and will be open for 10 AM on November 26 in the lobby outside the Council Chambers. Summary
Proposed amendments to the KCCCP were transmitted by the King County Executive on March 1, 2012 and received by the Council's Transportation, Economic and Environment Committee (TREEE). The TREEE conducted its review on July 23, 2012. The 2012 Comprehensive Plan Review Committee (CPRC) met on September 18, 2012 and reported out to the full Council a Shining Amendment to the subject legislation, without recommending text. Proposed KCCP policy amendments, contained in Attachment A to PO 2012-0102, which was reported out to the Committee of the whole on October 4, 2012 for the Council's consideration, would affect the following chapters in the Comprehensive Plan: Introduction, Regional Planning, Urban Communities, Rural Area, and Natural Resources Land, Environment, Parks, Open Space and Cultural Resources, Transportation Services, Facilities and Utilities, Economic Development, Commercial Plans, Transportation, and the Generaly. Proposed amendments to the text are more and less than those contained in Attachment A to PO 2012-0102.

Final Consideration
In addition to the proposed amendments contained in the subject legislation, Councilmembers may offer separate amendments for consideration by the Council. All such amendments proposed in any of the issues raised in the subject legislation should arrive in the Clerk's office on the public hearing on November 26, 2012. Amendments that will be considered for adoption by the Council on November 26, 2012 or thereafter include, but are not necessarily limited to:
- the amendment contained in the Executive's proposed version of the subject legislation;
- the amendments to the subject legislation adopted by the Council or the Committee of the whole;
- any amendments offered or discussed during the review of the subject legislation in the committee;
- any matter arising by a member of the Committee at the 2012 CPRC meeting;
- any amendments regarding the timing of the CIP/CP's recommendations to meet the UGB in the Council's comprehensive plan update process;
- any amendments reflecting Department of Ecology review of water quality changes to Shoreline Master Program;
- any amendments to the funding for capitalizing projects by the Shoreline Master Program; and
- any other proposed amendment that is within the scope of the amendments that have been available for public comment dates of hearing, notwithstanding that amendments of October, 2012.
