4	STATEMENT OF FACTS:	
5	1. RCW 57.16.010 requires that general comprehensive plans for wa	ter
6	districts be submitted to, and approved by, the legislative authority w	ithin
7	whose boundaries all or a portion of the district lies. K.C.C. 13.24.06	50
8	prescribes the requirements for approval of such plans, including	
9	consistency with state and local planning requirements.	
10	2. King County water district 54's last water system plan was prepare	ed in
11	2004. Both Washington state Department of Health and King County	7
12	regulations require water system plans to be updated every six years.	
13	3. King County water district 52 ("the district") is in King County an	d has
14	adopted a 2011 Comprehensive Water System Plan ("the plan").	
15	4. King County has adopted a comprehensive plan that includes water	r
16	supply policies in its provisions for facilities and services (policies F-	201
17	through F-244) that call for consistency with other adopted plans, sur	port
18	for regional water supply planning, pursuit of reclaimed water, water	
19	conservation and protection of water resources.	

20	5. K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires the utilities technical review committee
21	("UTRC") to review and make a recommendation to the King County
22	executive and council on the plan and the requirements under K.C.C.
23	chapter 13.24 and consistency with the King County Comprehensive Plan.
24	The UTRC has reviewed the planning data and district operations and
25	hereby finds:
26	a. The plan uses population and employment forecasts developed by the
27	Puget Sound Regional Council for the district's service area;
28	b. There is no portion of the district's service area located in
29	unincorporated King County;
30	c. The capital facility plan is adequate to meet anticipated facility and
31	service needs;
32	d. The plan is consistent with applicable Washington state water quality
33	laws, including the evaluation of reclaimed water use; and
34	e. The plan is consistent with other pertinent county adopted plans and
35	policies.
36	6. The Washington state Department of Health approval of the district's
37	plan is pending King County council action.
38	7. Under the state Environmental Policy Act the district delegated lead
39	agency status to the city of Des Moines. The district completed a state
40	Environmental Protection Act checklist. The city issued a determination
41	of nonsignificance for the issuance of the plan on May 10, 2011, and there
42	were no appeals.

43	8. The district's operations and facilities meet multiple existing statutory,
44	administrative and planning standards. As the district's operations,
45	facilities and planning meet the requirements of the K.C.C., and are
46	consistent with the King County Comprehensive Plan, the UTRC
47	recommends approval of the plan.
