# AMENDMENT TO THE CONSERVATION FUTURES INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN KINGCOUNTY AND THE CITY OF FOR OPEN SPACE ACQUISITION PROJECTS

#### **Preamble**

The King County Council, through Ordinance 9128, has established a Conservation Futures Levy Fund and appropriated proceeds to King County, the City of Seattle and certain suburban cities. This amendment is entered into to provide for the allocation of additional funds made available for open space acquisition.
THIS AMENDMENT is entered into between the CITY OF and KING COUNTY, and amends and attaches to and is part thereof of the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement entered into between the parties on the day of (Month), (Year), as previously amended.
The parties agree to the following amendments:
Amendment 1: Article 1. Recitals
A paragraph is hereby added to the Recitals Section to provide for a Conservation Futures Levy Fund allocation for the Acquisition, and hereafter reads:
• On, 201_ the King County Council passed Ordinance, which appropriated a total of(\$) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of for the Acquisition Project. On, 201 The King County Council passed Ordinance, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into interlocal agreements with the City for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds appropriated in Ordinance
Amendment 2: Article V. Conditions of Agreement
Section 5.1 is amended to include Attachment, which lists a 201_Conservation Futures Levy Allocation for the Acquisition project.
Amendment 3: Article VII, Responsibilities of County
The first two sentences of this article are amended to include references to Attachment, which lists a 201_ Conservation Futures Levy proceeds allocation for the Acquisition Project:
Subject to the terms of this agreement, the County will provide Conservation Futures Levy Funds in the amounts shown in Attachments A through, to be used for the Projects listed in Attachments A through The City may request

additional funds; however, the County has no obligation to provide funds to the City for the Projects in excess of the total amounts shown in Attachments A through \_\_\_. The County assumes no obligation for the future support of the Projects described herein except as expressly set forth in this agreement.

#### AMENDMENT 4: Attachment

The Attachments to the interlocal agreement are hereby amended by adding Attachment \_\_\_, which is hereby attached to the interlocal agreement, incorporated therein and made a part thereof.

In all other respects, the terms, conditions, duties and obligations of both parties shall remain the same as agreed to in the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement as previously amended.

This document shall be attached to the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.

#### **Conservation Futures (CFT) Project Descriptions**

#### 1122033 Auburn - WLCF Les Gove Park Expansion

This is a new four-parcel acquisition project totaling 1.44 acres on Auburn Way at 12th Street SE in downtown Auburn. The primary purpose of the project is to create a visual presence for Les Gove Park from Auburn Way South, one of Auburn's most traveled thoroughfares.

#### 1047227 Bellevue -WLCF BEL Bellevue Greenway and Open Space System

2014: \$650,000 is added to this multiple-parcel, multiple-year open space acquisition project. As a first priority, Bellevue will seek to acquire open space property in the Bridal Trails Community at a three-parcel, 15-acre wetland area located on 116th Avenue NE.

#### 1122034 Covington -WLCF South Covington Park

This new project consists of three parcels totaling 5.65 acres on SE Wax Road, in the Jenkins Creek corridor. There is a dual goal for the project. The first is to create a trail connection between the planned Covington Town Center, which is located nearby to the northeast, and a city-wide trail system that connects with other Covington parks and open spaces. The second goal is habitat protection along Jenkins Creek, which runs parallel to the future trail. The project site is critically located at a planned trail crossing on SE Wax Road.

#### 1047228 Issaquah - WLCF ISS Issaquah Creek Waterways

2014: \$250,000 is added to this project, which will acquire additional property within this multi-year, multi-parcel acquisition project, which has a goal of preserving critical streamside habitat. There are six target parcels along Issaquah Creek within the City of Issaquah. The first priority target acquisitions for this year are situated at or near the confluence of the main stem of Issaquah Creek and the North Fork of Issaquah Creek. The highest priority is a 1.61-acre property at the confluence of the two creek branches. The property contains important habitat for salmon and other aquatic and wildlife species.

#### 1112181 Kent - WLCF KNT Green River Parcels

2014: \$350,000 is added to this project for acquisition of the Holiday Kennels site, located on Russell Road south of Van Doren's Landing Park, to provide for habitat restoration and possible setting back of Russell Road in the Lower Green River corridor.

#### 1122035 Kirkland-WLCF Warsinske/Juanita Park

This new project consists of five undeveloped, wooded parcels totaling 1.89 acres, located at NE 124th Street 88th Place NE in Kirkland. The properties are an addition to Juanita Heights Park in the Juanita neighborhood of Kirkland.

#### 1122036 Normandy Park - WLCF Normandy Park Nearshore

The Normandy Park Nearshore project is a new project consisting of the acquisition of up to 8.72 acres and 300 feet of marine shoreline habitat on Puget Sound, at SW 199th Place in Normandy Park.

#### **Conservation Futures (CFT) Project Descriptions**

#### 1122037 Redmond - WLCF Bear Creek Trail Rehabilitation

This is a new 14.65-acre linear open space acquisition project in the corridor between State Route 520 and Bear Creek Parkway, which forms the southern boundary of the Redmond Town Center. This acquisition will allow for the restoration of approximately 3,500 feet of the stream channel of Bear Creek, immediately upstream from the creek's confluence with the Sammamish Slough. A trail in the corridor will also be moved to accommodate the stream restoration work.

### 1047226 Snoqualmie - WLCF Snoqualmie Riverfront Reach

2014: \$250,000 is added to this multiple-parcel, multi-year project to acquire riverfront open space properties along the Snoqualmie River in Snoqualmie.

#### 1122038 Woodinville - WLCF Little Bear Creek

This new project has a goal of acquiring an approximately .25-acre parcel in the Little Bear Creek corridor, just south of State Route 509 at 134th Avenue NE in Woodinville. Woodinville has a goal of restoring the natural riparian habitat of the property to help resident threatened chinook, coho, sockeye and kokanee in the creek.

#### 1122039 Seattle - WLFC West Seattle Junction

The West Seattle Junction Urban Village project is a new project that will acquire two parcels of approximately .26 acres to create a new community park in the mixed-use, high-density neighborhood near the intersection of SW Alaska Way and Fauntleroy Way.

# 1116261 Seattle - WLFC SEA Smith Cove Park Addition

2014: \$875,000 is added to this project to complete King County's Conservation Futures funding for this acquisition.

#### 1122040 Seattle - WLCF SEA South Park Plaza

This new project will establish an approximately 1.3-acre passive use greenspace within a larger park that is being created on 14th Avenue South, in the South Park community. It is located just north of the soon-to-be-completed South Park replacement bridge on the western shore of the Duwamish Waterway.

# 1122041 Seattle - WLFC SEA Baker Park Addition

The Baker Park Addition Project is a new project that will acquire a .25-acre property on 14th Avenue NW, immediately south of Baker Park in Seattle's Crown Hill Neighborhood. The goal is to enlarge the existing park, allow more light into it, and improve the general usability of the park.

# 1122042 Seattle - WLCF 48th and Charlestown

The goal of this new project is to acquire an approximately .25-acre property for a new local park in West Seattle. It is located at the corner of 48th Street SW and SW Charlestown Street.
