SUMMARY

The Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA) authorizes local jurisdictions to callect impact fees as a method of financing public facilities (i.e., roads, parks and open space, schools) that become necessary as a result of new method of financing public facilities (i.e., roads, parks and open space, schools) that become necessary as a result of new development.
