Proposed No. 2005-0303.2 Sponsors Gossett A MOTION authorizing the council chair to sign an 1 2 amendment to a contract with Staubach Northwest, LLC, dba The Staubach Company to amend the scope of services 3 4 and contract amount. 5 6 7 WHEREAS, the council has executed a technical services contract with Staubach 8 Northwest, LLC, dba The Staubach Company in the amount of \$24,500 to conduct 9 analyses of the executive's space plan, new county office building, work release and 10 elections facility proposals pending before the budget and fiscal management committee. 11 and 12 WHEREAS, Staubach Northwest, LLC, dba The Staubach Company was 13 awarded this contract after the council conducted the competitive procurement process 14 outlined in K.C.C. 4.16.030 for contracts under \$25,000, and 15 WHEREAS, at the time this procurement process was conducted, it was believed 16 that the amount of \$24,500 would be sufficient to cover the desired scope of services, and

17		WHEREAS, the budget and fiscal management committee has subsequently
18	•	determined that work above and beyond the original scope of services needs to be
19		performed, and
20		WHEREAS, the additional work consists of developing conceptual programming
21		alternatives for the county's short-term and long-term facility space plans and this work is
22		estimated to cost \$24,500, and
23		WHEREAS, the requirements of K.C.C. 4.16.030 would require the council to
24		conduct another procurement process for a separate contract for the additional scope of
25		services, and
26		WHEREAS, it would be inefficient and costly to hire a different consultant to
27		perform the work, and
28		WHEREAS, time is of the essence to make decisions related to the executive's
29		space plan proposals so that the costs of these proposals do not increase, and
30		WHEREAS, an efficient and timely alternative to conducting another
31		procurement process would be to amend the contract with Staubach Northwest LLC, dba
32		The Staubach Company to change the scope of services and increase the contract amount
33		by \$24,500, and
34		WHEREAS, this alternative requires the finance division to approve a waiver
35		from the standard procurement process, and
36		WHEREAS, a special market conditions waiver has been requested from and
37		approved by the finance division pursuant to K.C.C. 4.16.040, and
38		WHEREAS, increasing the contract amount by \$24,500 for the additional scope
39		of services would bring the total contract amount to \$49,000, and

40	WHEREAS, Motion 10651, Section III, as amended, and OR 1-020 requires the
41	council to authorize the council chair to sign contracts in excess of twenty-five thousand
42	dollars, and
43	WHEREAS, the council has already authorized the chair to sign the existing
44	contract with Staubach Northwest, LLC, dba The Staubach Company, but needs further
45	authorization to sign the contract amendment;
46	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
47	The chair of the metropolitan King County council is authorized to sign a contract
48	amendment, substantially in the form attached to this motion, not to exceed \$24,500 with
49	Staubach Northwest, LLC, dba The Staubach Company for the purpose of developing

RE: IMMEDIATE ATTENTION: Waiver from Standard Procurement Procedures

The Metropolitan King County Council is seeking approval of a waiver from standard procurement procedures in order to process an amendment to Contract No. T02364T. The current contract amount is \$24,500. The council seeks this waiver to add to the scope of services and increase the contract amount by \$24,500.

At the beginning of June, the Council received from the county executive a supplemental appropriation request of \$677,000 to conduct due diligence and planning activities necessary to evaluate whether to purchase the building at 1130 Rainier Avenue in Seattle. The Council also received legislation requesting that the Council determine which county agencies would relocate to offices in the new county office building.

The legislation is currently before the council's Budget and Fiscal Management (BFM) Committee. The county executive is requesting council action by July 29, 2005 because: (1) the due diligence activities must be initiated as soon as possible in order to make a decision on the purchase of the building by September 30, 2005; and (2) there is a need to make adjustments to purchase of construction materials for the new county office building that depend on the decisions pending before the Council on the new county office building.

The BFM committee determined that it needed some special expertise to help with its deliberations, and directed committee staff to develop a scope of services and secure a contract for consulting services. Based on the assumption that the scope of services could be performed for less than \$25,000, consistent with county code requirements, committee staff solicited telephone bids from three potential consultants. Two consultants were unable to meet the county's requirements or the required deadlines. The third consultant, The Staubach Company, submitted a proposal and the Council determined that Staubach was highly capable and could deliver the products in the scope of services. A contract for \$24,500 was executed.

Since that time, BFM committee members have requested additional analysis that was not included in the original scope of services. The additional analysis includes the following tasks:

Programming: The consultant shall provide a series of conceptual programming alternatives for the county's short-term and long-term space planning of facilities. The work shall include review of existing facilities and current short-term and long-term planning. The consultant shall review executive proposed recommendations, proposal of a series of consultant initiated alternatives, conceptual diagrams depicting alternatives, and a summary report of conclusions and recommendations.

We estimate this additional work will cost up to \$24,500, bringing the total contract cost to \$49,000.

The requirements of KCC 4.16.030 would require us to conduct another informal process for a separate contract. We are requesting a special market conditions waiver under KCC 4.16.040 for two reasons.

First, it would inefficient and more costly to have another consultant perform the work. The Staubach Company is now familiar with the executive's proposal and the county's operations and organizational structure. It would take time (and money) for another consultant to gain the necessary background to perform the work.

Second, time is of the essence. It would take valuable time to conduct another informal process and review proposals. The executive is asking for a decision by July 29, 2005, which would require BFM Committee action no later than July 20, 2005. Delay of the decision beyond that date could cost the county a substantial amount of money to make changes in construction of the new county office building. In addition, if the executive does not receive the funds to initiate the due diligence activities soon, and, as a result the executive and council do not have the information needed to make a decision by September 30, 2005 on purchasing the building, then the county's deposit of \$250,000 may be forfeited.

We believe our request meets the criterion for a proprietary purchase consistent with KCC 4.16.040. Thank you for your consideration of our request.
