1 AN ORDINANCE relating to creating the fire marshal 2 division in the department of development and 3 environmental services; and amending Ordinance 11955, 4 Section 5, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.16.055; Ordinance 5 7919, Section 9, as amended, and K.C.C. 6.40.080; 6 Ordinance 2097, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 7 17.04.020; Ordinance 12560, Section 154, as amended, and 8 K.C.C. 17.04.230; and Ordinance 14111, Section 205, as 9 amended, and K.C.C. 17.04.480. 10 11 12 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY: SECTION 1. Ordinance 11955, Section 5, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.16.055 are 13 14 each hereby amended to read as follows: 15 Department of development and environmental services — duties —

A. The department of development and environmental services is responsible to
manage and be fiscally accountable for the building services division, land use services
division, <u>fire marshal division</u> and administrative services division. The director of the
department shall be the county planning director, ((building official, fire marshal and))
zoning adjuster and ((the)) responsible official for purposes of administering the state
Environmental Policy Act, and may delegate those functions to qualified subordinates.
The department shall be responsible for regulating the operation, maintenance and
conduct of county-licensed businesses, except taxicab and for-hire drivers and vehicles.
The department shall be responsible for managing and coordinating the implementation
of Growth Management Act requirements, coordinating county and regional land use
planning with public and private agencies, developing proposed policies to address
regional land use planning and developing and overseeing the countywide program for
implementation of the county's Comprehensive Plan including coordinating the
implementation of plans that are developed by departments.

- B. The building services division shall be responsible for ensuring consistent and efficient administration of environmental, building and land use codes and regulations for commercial and residential projects by means of permit review and approval, construction inspections and public information. The manager of the building services division shall be the county building official. The duties of the division shall include the following:
 - 1. Permit center and public information;
- 2. Building plan and application review, including ((fire, fire flow,)) building, mechanical, barrier-free, energy, security and other uniform code reviews;

40	3. Site review, including engineering and ((sensitive)) critical areas review of
41	permit applications; and
42	4. Inspections, including new-construction inspections for compliance with
43	site((, fire)) and building code requirements((; and
44	5. Pursue and resolve code violations, including preparing for administrative or
45	legal actions, evaluating the division's success in obtaining compliance with King County
46	rules and regulations and designing measures to improve compliance)).
47	C. The land use services division shall be responsible for the effective processing
48	and timely review of land development proposals, including zoning variance and
49	reclassification, master drainage plans, variances from the surface water design manual
50	and the King County road standards, ((sensitive)) critical area, subdivision, right-of-way
51	use, urban planned development, clearing and grading, shoreline, special use and
52	conditional use applications. The duties of the division shall include the following:
53	1. Permit center and public information;
54	2. Plan review, including the review of applications for compliance with
55	shorelines, ((sensitive)) critical areas, subdivision and other zoning regulations, road
56	standards and variances from the surface water design manual, as well as community
57	plans and utility comprehensive plans;
58	3. Engineering review and inspection, including the review of clearing and
59	grading applications and review of engineering plans for compliance with adopted road
50	and drainage standards and specifications;
51	4. Development inspection, including inspection of construction activity to
52	ensure compliance with approved plans and codes:

63	5. Develop and assist in implementing local and subarea specific plans for urban
64	and rural areas, consistent with the Comprehensive Plan;
65	6. Develop proposed policies to address long-range comprehensive land use
66	planning and analyze and provide proposed updates to the Comprehensive Plan on an
67	annual basis;
68	7. Develop proposed county plans, programs and policies and implement
69	regulations on environmental issues, including ((environmentally sensitive)) critical areas
70	and mineral resources, and serve as the contact for cities and agencies, providing
71	appropriate research in support of county initiatives on these issues;
72	8. Administer the state Environmental Policy Act and act as lead agency,
73	including making the threshold determinations, determining the amount of environmental
74	impact and reasonable mitigation measures and coordinating with other departments and
75	divisions in the preparation of county environmental documents or in response to
76	environmental documents from other agencies; ((and))
77	9. Monitor the cumulative effects of the county's Comprehensive Plan and other
78	plans, policies and laws intended to protect natural and community resources while
79	permitting development and growth, and providing periodic status reports to the
80	executive and council; and
81	10. Pursue and resolve code violations, including preparing for administrative or
82	legal actions, evaluating the department's success in obtaining compliance with King
83	County rules and regulations and designing measures to improve compliance.
84	D. The fire marshal division shall be responsible for programs designed to reduce
85	the potential risk of fires and for investigating the causes of fires. The manager of the fire

86	marshal division shall be the county fire marshal. The duties of the division shall include
87	the following:
88	1. Development and implementation of an inspection program to identify fire
89	hazards and require conformance with K.C.C. Title 17;
90	2. Investigation into the origin, cause, circumstances and extent of loss of all
91	fires;
92	3. Review of building plans and applications for compliance with K.C.C. Title
93	<u>17; and</u>
94	4. Inspections, including inspections of new construction, for compliance with
95	K.C.C. Title 17.
96	E. The administrative services division shall provide support services throughout
97	the department, including personnel and payroll support, budget support, financial
98	services, information services, facilities management and support, and records
99	management and program analysis services.
100	SECTION 2. Ordinance 7919, Section 9, as amended, and K.C.C. 6.40.080 are
101	each hereby amended to read as follows:
102	Requirements for licensing/operation.
103	A. ((Massage business - public bathhouse.)) The director shall refer applications
104	for massage business – public bathhouse to the Seattle-King County ((health)) department
105	of public health and the King County fire marshal(('s office)) with a request to inspect the
106	premises or proposed premises and submit a written report as to its sanitary and safety
107	conditions ((and to submit a written report thereon; provided, however, that a)). An

108	application for a massage business conducted in the applicant's home shall not be referred
109	to the King County fire marshal(('s office)). All licensees shall:
110	1. Comply with the applicable safety and sanitation requirements of ((Section))
111	K.C.C. 6.40.100 ((of this chapter));
112	2. Keep business receipts showing the date of service(((s))) or services given, the
113	type of service(((s))) or services rendered and the name and license number of the
114	employee rendering the service(((s))) or services. These business receipts shall be retained
115	for a period of three years after the date of the services(((s))) or services, and shall be open
116	to inspection by the director and the King County department of public safety;
117	3. Allow any police officer, the director((-)) or a representative from the
118	Seattle-King County ((health)) department of public health or the King County fire
119	marshal(('s office)) entry to the premises during the hours the massage business or public
120	bathhouse is open for business, upon presentation of proper identification, for purposes of
121	inspecting the premises;
122	4. Provide that all doors in ((such)) the premises, excluding doors in office and
123	storage rooms, unless ((such)) the doors provide access to service areas, are so equipped
124	that they may not be fastened shut so as to prevent reasonable access by ((such)) the
125	authorities <u>listed in subsection A.2. or 3. of this section</u> who announce their authority to
126	enter prior to inspection of ((such)) the premises;
127	5. Comply with the applicable standards of conduct requirements set out in
128	((Section)) K.C.C. 6.40.110 ((of this chapter));
129	6. Comply with the applicable provisions of the King County building, fire and

131	7. Submit proof of a current Washington State massage business license;
132	8. Shall post in a prominent place a list of all services offered with a brief
133	description of what the service entails along with the costs for such services. All business
134	transactions with customers must be conducted in accordance with said posted list; and
135	9. Shall not distribute or consume liquor ((and/))or controlled substances on
136	licensed premises.
137	B. ((Massage practitioner.)) All applicants for a massage practitioner's license or
138	license renewal shall:
139	1. Be at least eighteen years of age;
140	2. Submit to a background check in accordance with the procedures of the King
141	County department of public safety;
142	3. Submit proof of a current Washington State massage license;
143	4. Comply with the applicable standards of conduct requirements of ((Section))
144	K.C.C. 6.40.110 ((of this chapter)); and
145	5. Comply with the applicable safety and sanitation requirements of ((Section))
146	K.C.C. 6.40.100 ((of this chapter)).
147	SECTION 3. Ordinance 2097, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 17.04.020 are
1.48	each hereby amended to read as follows:
149	Term amendments. Whenever the following words appear in this code, they are
150	to be changed as follows:
151	A. "Fire chief," "chief of the fire department," "fire prevention engineer" and
152	"fire code official" to "King County fire marshal".
153	B. <u>"Fire department"</u> to <u>"King County fire marshal(('s office))</u> <u>division."</u>

154	C. ((Fire marshal to director, department of development and environmental
155	services.
156	D.)) "Department" to "the department of development and environmental
157	services."
158	SECTION 4. Ordinance 12560, Section 154, as amended, and K.C.C. 17.04.230
159	are each hereby amended to read as follows:
160	General authority and responsibilities – General – Duties of the fire
161	marshal((2's office)) division and fire districts. Section 104.1 of the International Fire
162	Code is supplemented with the following:
163	Duties of the fire marshal((2's office)) division and fire districts (IFC 104.1.3).
164	1. The ((F))fire marshal(('s Office)) division within the King County department
165	of development and environmental services shall be operated under the direction of the
166	Fire marshal, and shall have responsibility for investigation, administration and
167	inspection functions to promote compliance of the fire prevention provisions of this code.
168	2. The Chiefs of the King County Fire Districts and((/or)) Fire Departments shall
169	have responsibility for fire suppression or extinguishing provisions of this code within
170	their respective jurisdictions.
171	3. The ((Fire marshal's Office)) fire marshal may, by written contract, delegate to
172	the chiefs of the fire districts ((and/))or fire departments authority for inspections of the
173	fire prevention provisions of this code within their respective jurisdictions.
174	4. The ((Fire marshal's Office)) fire marshal division may, at the request of a fire
175	districts ((and/))or fire department((s)), assume an advisory status in matters of

176	operations, function, expenditure, tactics, personnel and equipment or any other function
177	performed by the fire district((s)) or fire department((s)).
178	SECTION 5. Ordinance 14111, Section 205, as amended, and K.C.C. 17.04.480
179	are each hereby amended to read as follows:
180	General - Construction documents. Section 901.2 of the International Fire
181	Code is not adopted and the following is substituted:
182	Construction documents (IFC 901.2). Complete plans and specifications for
183	fire alarm systems; water-mains supplying required fire flow, fire-extinguishing systems,
184	including automatic sprinklers and wet dry standpipes; halon or clean agent systems and
185	other special types of automatic fire-extinguishing systems; basement pipe inlets; and
186	other fire-protection systems and appurtenances thereto shall be submitted to the fire
187	marshal(('s office)) for review and approval prior to system installation. Plans and
188	specifications for fire alarm systems shall include, but not be limited to, a floor plan;
189	location of all alarm-initiating and alarm-signaling devices; alarm control- and trouble-
190	signaling equipment; annunciation; power connection; battery calculations; conductor
191	type and sizes; voltage drop calculations; and manufacturer, model numbers and listing
192	information for all equipment, devices and materials.
193	SECTION 6. Effective date. This ordinance takes effect January 1, 2006.
194	SECTION 7. Severability. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to

any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
