Proposed No. 2004-0243.1 **Sponsors** Edmonds and Hague 1 AN ORDINANCE relating to arts and culture in King 2 County; amending the allocation of hotel-motel tax 3 revenues in the King County arts and cultural development 4 fund; making technical corrections; and amending 5 Ordinance 14440, Section 3, as amended and K.C.C. 6 4.42.025. 7 8 9 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY: 10 SECTION 1. Ordinance 14440, Section 3, as amended, and K.C.C. 4.42.025 are 11 each hereby amended to read as follows: 12 Hotel-motel revenue allocations for cultural programs. 13 A. Hotel-motel revenues deposited in the King County arts and cultural 14 development fund, created under K.C.C. 4.08.190, shall be administered by the cultural 15 development authority. 16 B. Hotel-motel revenues deposited in the King County arts and cultural 17 development fund shall be used to support the cultural programs described in K.C.C.

18	chapter 2.48: cultural facilities; cultural education; special projects; and sustained
19	support. The hotel-motel revenues in the fund shall also support related administration of
20	those programs by the cultural development authority.
21	C. Through December 31, 2012, at least forty percent of the hotel-motel revenues
22	appropriated to the arts and cultural development fund and transferred to the cultural
23	development authority shall be deposited in an account and used to establish cultural
24	endowment. Principle and interest shall be managed by the cultural development
25	authority in accordance with RCW 67.28.180(3)(a).
26	D. After allocating the hotel-motel portion of the arts and cultural development
27	fund to administer cultural programs and to build the cultural endowment, the cultural
28	development authority shall divide the hotel-motel revenues in the arts and cultural
29	development fund between arts programs and heritage programs, but at least twenty
30	percent of the revenue shall be allocated to heritage programs.
31	E. Beginning January 1, 2002, outstanding debt service obligations shall be
32	financed from hotel-motel revenues in the arts and cultural development fund. The
33	obligations incurred before December 31, 2002, shall be managed by the department of
34	executive services and paid by the cultural development authority.
35	F. After deducting the amount necessary to meet debt service obligations, the
36	cultural development authority shall allocate hotel-motel revenues intended to support
37	arts programs from the arts and cultural development fund as follows:
38	1. For <u>cultural facilities and</u> sustained support, ((thirty-nine)) <u>eighty percent</u> of
39	the remaining arts program revenues, but sustained support shall receive at least thirty

41	2. ((For cultural facilities, thirty-nine percent of remaining arts program
42	revenues;
43	3.)) For special projects and cultural education, ((thirteen)) twenty percent of the
44	remaining arts program revenues, but special projects shall receive at least thirty-four
45	percent of the twenty percent((; and
46	4. For cultural education, nine percent of remaining arts program revenues)).
47	G. After deducting the amount necessary to meet debt service allocations, the
48	cultural development authority shall allocate hotel-motel revenues intended to support
49	heritage programs from the arts and cultural development fund as follows:
50	1. For cultural facilities and sustained support, seventy percent of remaining
51	heritage program revenues, but sustained support shall receive at least twenty percent of
52	the seventy percent; and
53	2. For special projects and cultural education, ((twenty)) thirty percent of the
54	remaining heritage program revenues, but special projects shall receive at least thirty-four
55	percent of the thirty percent((; and
56	3. For cultural education, ten percent of remaining heritage program revenues)).
57	H. Hotel-motel revenues from the arts and cultural development fund shall not be
58	used to support services and programs to be provided by the King County landmarks
59	commission for land use regulation and archaeological resource management purposes as
50	described in K.C.C. chapter 20.62.

61 SECTION 2.
