1	AN ORDINANCE authorizing the executive to enter into
2	an interlocal cooperation agreement for open space
3	acquisition projects with the city of Seattle, for the Salmon
4	Bay acquisition project authorized by Ordinance 14517.

7	STATEMENT OF FACTS:
8	1. Conservation futures tax levy funds are collected through King County
9	as a dedicated portion of the property tax and are, by statute, available
10	only for the acquisition of open space and resource lands.
11	2. Ordinance 14714 establishes a process for the distribution of
12	conservation futures tax levy funds, which includes allocation of
13	conservation futures funds by the council.
14	3. On November 25, 2002 the King County council adopted Ordinance
15	14517 and allocated \$200,000 in conservation futures funds to the Salmon
16	Bay acquisition project.

17	4. The county desires to disburse conservation futures funds to the city of
18	Seattle and suburban cities and must do so by amending existing or
19	executing new interlocal agreements with these jurisdictions.
20	5. King County is authorized to enter into an interlocal agreement with
21	the cities pursuant to chapter 39.34 RCW, the Interlocal Cooperation Act.
22	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
23	SECTION 1. The King County executive is hereby authorized to enter into an

# AMENDMENT TO THE CONSERVATION FUTURES INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN KING COUNTY AND THE CITY OF SEATTLE FOR OPEN SPACE ACQUISITION PROJECTS

#### **Preamble**

The King County Council, through Ordinance 9128, has established a Conservation Futures Levy Fund and appropriated proceeds to King County, the City of Seattle and certain suburban cities through the procedures set forth in Ordinance 8867, as amended by Ordinance 14714. This amendment is entered into to provide for the allocation of additional funds made available for open space acquisition.

THIS AMENDMENT is entered into between the CITY OF SEATTLE and KING COUNTY, and amends and attaches to and is part thereof of the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement entered into between the parties on the 5th day of June, 1990, as previously amended.

The parties agree to the following amendments:

#### **Amendment 1: Article 1. Recitals**

A paragraph is hereby added to the Recitals Section to provide for the 2003 Conservation Futures Levy Fund allocation, and hereafter reads:

•	"On November 25, 2002 the King County Council passed Ordinance 14517, which
	appropriated a total of two hundred thousand (\$200,000) in Conservation Futures Levy
	proceeds to the City of Seattle for the Salmon Bay Acquisition Project. On
	the King County Council passed Ordinance, authorizing the
	King County Executive to enter into interlocal agreements with the City Seattle for the
	disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds appropriated in Ordinance 14517".

### **Amendment 2: Article V. Conditions of Agreement**

Section 5.1 is appended to include Attachment S, which lists a 2003 Conservation Futures Levy allocation for the City of Seattle's Salmon Bay acquisition project.

#### **Amendment 3: Article VII. Responsibilities of County**

The first two sentences of this article are appended to include Attachment S, which lists the 2003 Conservation Futures Levy proceeds allocation for the City of Seattle's Salmon Bay acquisition project, and hereafter read:

Subject to the terms of this agreement, the County will provide Conservation Futures Levy Funds in the amounts shown in Attachments A through S to be used for the Projects listed in Attachments A through S. The City may request additional funds; however, the County has no obligation to provide funds to the City for the Projects in excess of the total amounts shown in Attachments A through S. The County assumes no obligation for the future support of the Projects described herein except as expressly set forth in this agreement.

In all other respects, the terms, conditions, duties and obligations of both parties shall remain the same as agreed to in the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement as previously amended.

This document shall be attached to the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.
