1	A MOTION requesting that the executive develop and
2	transmit a report that reviews and assesses gaps in existing
3	emergency action plans associated with dams in King
4	County and evacuation and sheltering plans in the
5	watersheds to serve populations that would be affected by
6	potential dam failures and provides a prioritized list of
7	recommended steps to update or, where missing, create
8	emergency action plans and evacuation and sheltering
9	plans.
10	WHEREAS, threat of collapse of the Oroville Dam spillway resulted in
11	evacuation orders for more than one hundred eighty thousand people, and
12	WHEREAS, over one hundred dams exist in King County's river basins in
13	proximity to the county's residents, and
14	WHEREAS, many types of emergency events could damage the dams in King
15	County, including earthquakes, flooding and structural failure;
16	WHEREAS, while a remote possibility, failure of a dam in King County could, in
17	some instances, have catastrophic effects on human life, property and the environment,
18	and
19	WHEREAS, protecting residents and property from injury and damage by natural

disasters is a fundamental role of government, and 20 WHEREAS, preevacuation planning can greatly reduce harmful impacts from 21 dam failure, and 22 WHEREAS, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission requires preparation of 23 an emergency action plan for all dams whose failure would endanger human life or cause 24 substantial property damage; and 25 WHEREAS, King County in collaboration with the United States Army Corps of 26 Engineers and other affected jurisdictions conducted preevacuation planning and 27 developed evacuation routes for use in the event of failure of the Howard Hanson dam on 28 the Green river, and 29 WHEREAS, similar planning may be warranted in the county's other major river 30 basins, including the Cedar River basin, Snoqualmie River basin and White River basin, 31 32 and WHEREAS, the mission of King County's office of emergency management is to 33 provide regional leadership to strengthen community resilience and access to emergency 34 services, and 35 WHEREAS, in 2007, the King County Flood Control Zone District was 36 established to provide a proactive, regional approach to flooding as well as funding to 37 improve the county's nearly five hundred aging and inadequate flood protection facilities; 38 NOW THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: 39 A. King County's office of emergency management shall, in collaboration with 40 the water and land resources division, the King County Flood Control Zone District, 41 cities, tribal nations, unincorporated communities, dam owners and other interested 42

parties, coordinate the development and transmittal of a report to the King County 43 44 council and the King County Flood Control Zone District that: 45 1. Identifies and assesses gaps in: 46 a. existing emergency action plans in the watersheds of the Cedar River basin, 47 Green River basin, Snoqualmie River basin and White River basin; and b. adopted county and city evacuation and sheltering plans in the watersheds 48 identified in subsection A.1.a. that would serve populations that would be affected by 49 50 potential dam failures; and 2. Provides a prioritized list of recommended steps to update or, where missing, 51 52 create emergency action plans and county evacuation plans and associated sheltering plans. 53 B. The executive should transmit the report required in subsection A. of this 54 motion by August 31, 2017, in the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with 55 the clerk of the council, who shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all 56 councilmembers, the council chief of staff, the policy staff director, the executive director

- of the King County Flood Control District and the lead staff for the law and justice
- 59 committee, or its successor.
