2	Beginning on page 3, line 55, strike lines 55 through 68, and insert:
3	"1. Program participants engaged in job search ((pay seven dollars fifty cents
4	per day, except for in-custody community corrections program eligible inmates who pay
5	four dollars per day for the first two weeks, then seven dollars fifty cents per day
6	thereafter. Inmates who were previously employed, became unemployed while on the
7	program and are placed in a job search category pay seven dollars fifty cents per day)),
8	who become unemployed while on the program, who are enrolled in educational
9	programs, or who receive treatment while in the program will not be subject to a daily
10	room and board rate.
11	2. ((Program participants enrolled in educational programs pay three dollars per
12	day for high school and GED programs and eight dollars per day while enrolled in college
13	classes, trade, or technical schools.
14	3. Program participants who receive outside treatment pay seven dollars per day.
15	4.)) Out-of-county program participants shall be charged the same daily rate as
16	charged to contracting agencies.
17	((5.)) 3. Should the net maintenance fee be lower than the daily room and board
18	rate the net maintenance fee shall be the amount charged."

20	EFFECT: The Department of Adult and Juvenile Detention does not currently charge
21	fees for persons who are searching for work, going to school, or receiving treatment
22	because the program currently does not accept these persons. Nevertheless, if the
23	programs were expanded, these individuals would be charged a fee. The amendment
24	would eliminate fees for these individuals in the future if the program is expanded.
25	The actual revenue from these fees would likely be minimal, and like the Medical Co-
26	pay, difficult to collect. In addition, like the elimination of these fees would be in
27	keeping with the County ESJI policies, because the fees have a negative impact on
28	persons of color and those who are financially disadvantaged.
