1	AN ORDINANCE o	reating the Ruth Woo emerging
2	leaders fellowship p	rogram; and adding a new chapter to
3	K.C.C. Title 2.	
4	PREAMBLE:	
5	The Ruth Woo emerging lea	aders fellowship program is named after
6	revered community leader F	Ruth Woo. Woo started her career in public
7	service as an administrative	professional to former Governor Dan Evans
8	and later became a mentor t	o several elected officials, including former
9	King County Executive Gar	y Locke.
10	At a young age, Woo witnes	ssed the impacts of policymaking when she
11	and her family were incarce	rated at Tule Lake during World War II. This
12	life event motivated Woo to	use her influence to increase diversity in
13	government institutions to e	nsure they reflect the communities they serve.
14	Although Woo passed away	July 13, 2016, this program honors her life's
15	work and passion in opening	g doors for youth from backgrounds that have
16	historically lacked equitable	access to education, employment and
17	professional development of	pportunities to enter public service.
18	This program will also furth	er the county's Equity and Social Justice
19	Strategic Plan 2016-2022 of	pjectives that, "(by) 2022, all departments and

20	agencies have fully active school-to-work pipelines from economically	
21	disadvantaged communities." In addition, it will further the plan's goal	
22	that "(m)ost of our workforce - at every level of all agencies/departments -	
23	consistently reflect our region's changing demographics."	
24	It is the county's desire that upon completion of the fellowship the Ruth	
25	Woo fellow understands the branches of government and the importance	
26	of civic engagement, and appreciates public service in its many forms,	
27	such as by elected officials, staff, stakeholders and the public.	
28	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:	
29	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this ordinance should constitute a new chapter in	
30	K.C.C. Title 2.	
31	NEW SECTION. SECTION 2. A. The Ruth Woo emerging leaders fellowship	
32	is hereby created. The fellowship shall be a paid, full-time, term-limited temporary	
33	position and shall be awarded to a person with a commitment to public service. Priority	
34	in selection will be given to economically disadvantaged college graduates from	
35	backgrounds that have historically lacked equitable access to education, employment, and	
36	professional development opportunities. There shall be one fellow per year and for a	
37	term of one year.	
38	B. A fellow shall be an employee of the human resources management division.	
39	A fellow shall be assigned to work in various county agencies for periods of three to four	
40	months at a time with the written approval of the presiding elected official or designee of	
41	such agency. The assignments shall include time with the council and with executive	
42	branch agencies. While assigned to an agency the fellow shall be subject to the

administrative supervision of that agency.	
C. The Ruth Woo fellow shall have the following responsibilities:	
1. Assignments may include following a piece of legislation through the	
legislative process, preparing briefings, correspondence or other documents,	
communicating with constituents and other county departments, assisting in outreach and	
executive branch policy administration;	
2. The work in the branches and departments shall include:	
a. working on projects related to each branch or department and seeing them to	
completion;	
b. experiencing by directly working on them how policies are developed and	
implemented and how they relate to the communities served by the county;	
c. participating in internship orientations, workshops and policy exercises; and	
d. maintaining professional, nonpartisan conduct.	
D. Each agency shall reimburse the human resources management division for	
the cost of the fellow for the period assigned to the agency.	
E. Annually, a committee to review applicants for the fellowship shall be formed,	
composed of members appointed by the executive and the chair of the council. The

- 61 applicants, shall screen, interview and score the applicants and shall recommend to the
- 62 human resources division appointment of the fellow.
