1	AN ORDINANCE relating to the department of public		
2	defense; authorizing the department to provide legal		
3	representation in the inquest process to families of		
4	decedents; and adding a new section to K.C.C. chapter		
5	2.60.		
6	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:		
7	SECTION 1. Findings:		
8	A. Section 895 of the King County Charter states, "An inquest shall be held to		
9	investigate the causes and circumstances of any death involving a member of the law		
10	enforcement agency of the county in the performance of the member's duties."		
11	B. Between 2012 and 2016, there have been thirty-four inquests ordered by the		
12	executive in which families of the decedents have participated.		
13	C. During 2017 the executive ordered eight inquests.		
14	D. Families whose loved ones have been killed by a member of a law		
15	enforcement agency may seek to understand through the inquest process the cause and		
16	circumstances of the decedent's death.		
17	E. The inquest process involves formal legal proceedings, discovery and cross-		
18	examination of persons, including law enforcement personnel and expert witnesses.		
19	F. Many of the families participating in the inquest process have been		

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unrepresented by legal counsel and have not had the benefit of legal expertise to assist them in understanding the legal proceedings, examining evidence or discovery or in the preparation of questions for law enforcement personnel and others.

G. The lack of legal representation may discourage families from participating in the inquest process.

<u>NEW SECTION. SECTION 2.</u> There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 2.60 a new section to read as follows:

A. There is a public benefit in providing publicly financed legal counsel in the inquest process to participating families of the decedents. The inquest process is a formal legal proceeding, involving discovery of documents and witnesses and cross examination of witnesses, including law enforcement personnel and experts. Publicly financed legal counsel will allow all families to participate equitably in the inquest process regardless of financial means. There is a public interest in knowing the cause and circumstances of any death involving a member of a law enforcement agency in the performance of the member's duties. The findings of an inquest help the public, family members of decedents and policy makers understand the causes and circumstances of the decedent's death. The provision of legal counsel for all families of decedents will promote a transparent, orderly and rigorous inquest process to most effectively and equitably investigate the causes and circumstances of a person's death. Therefore, the department shall provide legal representation at public expense to the family participating in an inquest, regardless of the income level of the members of the family, of the person whose death is the subject of an inquest investigating the causes and circumstances of death involving a member of any law enforcement agency within King County pursuant to

- Section 895 of the King County Charter or R.C.W. 36.24.020. Representation shall not be provided if the family does not wish to be represented by the department's attorneys. If family members have a conflict of interest as determined by the department under the state bar rules of professional conduct such that the same attorney should not represent more than one family member during the inquest process, the department may provide separate counsel to each family member for whom a conflict exists. The legal representation shall be limited to preparation for the inquest and participation during the inquest and shall not include any representation for the purpose of potential related civil litigation.
- B. The executive shall revise any executive orders relating to inquests to reflect the provisions of this ordinance within one hundred twenty days of enactment of this ordinance.
 - C. For the purposes of this section:
- 1. "Family" refers to those individuals determined by the court to have a right to participate as the family of the deceased.

58	2. "A member of a law enforcement agency" means a commissioned officer or		
59	non-commissioned staff of a local or state police force, jail or corrections agency.
