RCW 38.52.400



RCW Search and rescue activities — Powers and duties of local officials.

(1) The chief law enforcement officer of each political subdivision shall be responsible for local search and rescue activities. Operation of search and rescue activities shall be in accordance with state and local operations plans adopted by the elected governing body of each local political subdivision



Spotlight: Evidence Search Federal Way, July

- Assisted Federal Way PD in search for human remains
 - Cleared and searched a large overgrown area Found remains of subject that had been missing for 12 years Case is now closed

Note: We've conducted 18 evidence searches this year, some for very high profile cases

Update: KCSARA Advisory Board

- Currently 10 members
- Added 6 members in December
- They are all passionate about Search and Rescue and helping us help others
- Goals:
 - Improve our connections with community, business and its leaders
 - Raise awareness of what we do
 - Strategic advice / counsel
 - Expand our fundraising activities (e.g. annual fundraising dinner)

Update: Team Tracking System

- System is now operational
- Improved team safety and reduced radio traffic
- Expanded number of kits:
 - KCSO Van (10)
 - ESAR (5)
 - SMR (5)
- Added new portable antennas



New Initiative – Denny Mt Repeater

- Funded and installed new Denny Mountain repeater at Alpental, Snoqualmie Pass
- Improved coverage for Alpine Lakes and also into Kittitas Co
- Adding new frequency requires massive radio programming effort (600+ volunteers and all SAR vehicles)

Initiative Under Analysis

KCSARA UAS Program

- UAS (drones) increasingly used in public safety globally
- Benefits:
 - Reduces risk to rescuers avalanche, water, steep, etc.
 - Saves lives get further, faster and cover more terrain
 - Safer, cheaper and more available ideal complement to helicopters if terrain/weather precludes
- Evaluating a UAS program from a number of perspectives structural, operational, practical, FAA/legal, liability etc.
- Would be used in rural/remote areas
- Technology Committee Chair has met with FAA, Cowlitz Co, two counties in Colorado, police depts from CA, TX and ND, etc. to discuss best practices

KCSARA UAS Program

Core principles:

- Follow relevant laws
- Respect privacy, civil rights and civil liberties (follow ACLU government drone recommendations)
- Ensure public support for SAR use
- Mitigate Risk to lowest possible level
- Embrace a safety oriented philosophy
- Act in the public interest

Continue to investigate & discuss with KCSO

SAR Headquarters

Current Status

- We have 14 registered vehicles owned by our non-profit units
- 4 of these unit vehicles and two 20ft shipping containers used for storing field, evidence search and medical training equipment are currently located at Eastside Fire and Rescue HQ
- In 2015 ESF-R asked us to find another location as their space needs continue to expand...
- The other vehicles are "scattered around" at people's houses etc.
- We have no space for meetings, training etc. and are still nomadic.

Interim HQ Location

- Finalized 2-5 year lease on Snoqualmie Valley Hospital east campus (I-90 Exit 25)
- Thank you for supporting cost of fencing and other improvements needed to store vehicles and equipment securely

➔ Finding a long term headquarters location along the I-90 corridor (exit 17-31) is of critical importance to the long term future of SAR in King County

Upcoming Asks

- Explore moving our 14 non-profit owned unit vehicles to "direct charge" registration/insurance through the county
- Support for unit vehicle fuel and maintenance through county shops – approx \$40k/yr
- Misc spending approximately \$20k/yr including King County Radio shop for work on our repeaters, and 800MHz radios in some of our unit vehicles

→ Could these items be covered through a \$60k annual appropriation added to the sheriff's office SAR budget?
