



### Needs and gaps in Snoqualmie Valley

In King County, there are many organizations that say they provide transportation services throughout the county. We looked into each one and this is what we found.

- American Cancer Society: No volunteers in the valley.
- Catholic Community Services: Chore service only in Snoqualmie Valley – no transportation
- Eastside Friends of Seniors: Issaquah and Sammamish residents only – no service in Snoqualmie Valley
- Kaiser Permanente: No availability in Snoqualmie Valley
- Mercer Island Parks & Recreation: No senior rides/No Snoqualmie Valley
- Multifaith Works: Not in Snoqualmie Valley
- Northwest Kidney Centers: No assistance in Snoqualmie Valley
- SeaTac Community Center: No Snoqualmie Valley
- U S Veterans Administration: No service in Snoqualmie Valley
- Volunteers of America: No availability in Snoqualmie Valley

### What we have:

- SVT – Fixed route, deviated fixed route, circulator loops and demand response. Various times, for \$1 per ride. No weekend service. Covers all valley cities but limited availability for door-to-door routes.

- Hyde Shuttle (seniors and individuals with disabilities only – very limited services through Fall City, Carnation, and Duvall). No weekend service.
- Sounds Generations Volunteer Ride Program – Operated by SVT - Upper Valley only. Seniors only for medical appointments in Bellevue, Seattle & Issaquah. No weekends.
- Duvall Community Van – can go between points in Duvall and anywhere in King County. Trips must be booked by at least two people in advance and then a volunteer driver is arranged. \$2.75 per person, round trip. Riders must be able to get themselves to the local van.
- Hopelink through Snoqualmie Tribe – local for Medicaid Tribal members going to tribal health care clinics only.
- King County Metro ACCESS – throughout King County for clients who live within ¾ miles of fixed route services between the hours of 9am and 3pm. No Sunday service in the Valley.
- King County Metro Fixed Route services
  - 208 – Service between North Bend, Snoqualmie and Issaquah Transit Center – operates M-Sat every 2 – 2.5 hours. No Sunday Service.
  - 628 – Peak Route service M-F 5:30am – 9am and 5:45pm – 9pm every half-hour to the Issaquah Highlands P & R. No weekend service.
  - 224 – Fixed route bus every 1.5 – 2 hrs between Duvall & Redmond Transit Center. No weekend service.
  - 232 – AM only M-F about once per hour between 520am and 8am from Duvall to Redmond, Overlake and Bellevue transit centers. No weekend service.
  - Trailhead Direct – goes from Seattle to Mt. Si trailhead for hikers – weekends only – summer only.
