



2018: Convention Center Construction

- Effective Date: July 2018
- Areas Impacted: Countywide
- Routes Impacted: Metro 41,
 74, 101, 102, 150, 255, ST 550
- Mitigation:
 - 12,300 transit service hours
 - New on-street layover and stops, path for buses to enter/exit DSTT
- Communications: Alerts, posting at stops, rider alerts



2018: D2 Roadway Closure

- Effective Date: Fall 2018
 Service Change (Sept. 25)
- Areas Impacted: Eastside,
 Seattle Rainier Ave
- Routes Impacted: Metro 111, 114, 212, 214, 216, 217, 218, 219, 630; ST 550 and 554
- Mitigation: Some service will be redirected to another Rainier Ave stop
- Communications: Alerts, posting at stops, rider alerts, street teams



2019: Alaskan Way Viaduct Closure & Demolition

- Effective Date: January 11, 2019
- Areas Impacted: West Seattle, Burien,
 Normandy Park, Des Moines
- Routes Impacted: 21X, 37, 55, 56, 57, 113, 120, 121, 122, 123, 125, C Line
- Mitigation: Service re-routed to new pathways; added service hours to maintain service reliability and same number of trips
- Communications: Multi-lingual brochure, alerts, posting at stops, social media



2019: Montlake Freeway Station Closure

- Effective Date: March 23, 2019
- Areas Impacted: North Eastside,
 Seattle
- Routes Impacted: Metro 252,
 255, 257, 268, 311, ST 545
- Mitigation: Expanded Route 542
- Communications: Joint effort with WSDOT & ST; Rider alerts on routes and at stops; street teams



2019: End of Joint Operations in DSTT

- Effective Date: March 23, 2019
- Areas Impacted: North Seattle, Eastside, SE King County
- Routes Impacted: Metro 41, 74, 101, 102, 150, 255; ST 550
- Mitigation: Reroutes to new surface pathways; added service hours to maintain service reliability and number of trips; capital improvements to pathways and bus stops
- Communications: Joint effort with SDOT and ST in advance of service change; Multiple efforts including rider alerts, street teams, social media, web presence

2019: North Eastside Mobility Project

- Effective Date: September 2019
- Areas Impacted*: Bothell, Kirkland, Kenmore,
 Woodinville, and Redmond
- Routes Impacted*: Metro 234, 235, 236, 238, 243, 244, 245, 248, 249, 255, 277, 930, Community Van, Community Ride; ST 540
- Related Projects: UW hub and Montlake Triangle improvements
- Communications: Joint effort with ST; Multiple efforts including open houses, online survey, street teams, social media, web presence



^{*}Impacts come only with the action alternative – there is still a no-action alternative that leaves the network virtually unchanged.
