1 AN ORDINANCE authorizing the King County executive  
2 to enter into an interagency agreement between King  
3 County, a political subdivision of the state of Washington  
4 and the city of Renton, a municipal corporation in the state  
5 of Washington, regarding design, construction, ownership,  
6 operation and maintenance of the portion of Segment A of  
7 the Lake to Sound trail that is within the city.

8 STATEMENT OF FACTS:

- 9 1. King County and the city of Renton are working collaboratively to  
10 construct what is known as Segment A of the Lake to Sound trail, a  
11 segment of trail that traverses the Black River Riparian forest, crossing  
12 Monster Road and connecting to the Green River trail in the city of  
13 Tukwila's Fort Dent park.
- 14 2. Segment A will be a critical segment of the larger sixteen-mile regional  
15 Lake to Sound trail, extending from the southern end of Lake Washington  
16 to Puget Sound as part of a recreation and transportation corridor, and will  
17 provide health benefits to residents of cities and King County.
- 18 3. Under RCW 36.89.050, King County is authorized to construct a park  
19 or recreational facility and transfer to a city the county's ownership interest

20 in, and the operation and maintenance obligations for, the facility,  
21 provided the city continues to use the facility for the same purposes or  
22 conveys other equivalent facilities to King County in exchange thereof.

23 4. King County received one million two hundred ninety thousand dollars  
24 in Federal Highway Administration grant funds, five hundred thousand  
25 dollars in State Recreation and Conservation Office grant funds and is also  
26 using county levy moneys, in accordance with to King County Ordinance  
27 17941, for the design and construction of Segment A.

28 5. After construction, King County intends to convey ownership of  
29 Segment A of the trail to the city of Renton. The city is ready, willing and  
30 able to assume ownership of this facility.

31 6. The parks and recreation division of the department of natural  
32 resources and parks will operate and maintain the trail for use by the  
33 general public as a regional trail.

34 7. King County and the city have negotiated their respective rights, roles  
35 and responsibilities regarding Segment A in this interagency agreement.

36 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

37 SECTION 1. The King County executive is hereby authorized to enter into an  
38 interagency agreement between King County and the city of Renton, substantially in the  
39 form of Attachment A to this ordinance, for the design, construction, ownership,

40 operation and maintenance of the portion of Segment A of the Lake to Sound trail that is  
41 within the city.
