TITLE AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED ORDINANCE 2019-0084, VERSION 1

On page 1, beginning on line 1, strike lines 1 through 20, and insert: 3 "AN ORDINANCE providing for the submission to the 4 qualified electors of King County at a special election to be 5 held in King County on August 6, 2019, of a proposition 6 authorizing a property tax levy in excess of the levy 7 limitation contained in chapter 84.55 RCW for a period of 8 six consecutive years, at a total rate of not more than 9 \$0.1832 per one thousand dollars of assessed valuation in 10 the first year and limiting annual levy increases by the King 11 County inflation plus population index published by the 12 King County office of economic and financial analysis, or 13 the chapter 84.55 RCW limitation, whichever is greater in 14 years two through six for the purpose of maintaining and 15 operating King County's open space system; improving 16 parks, recreation, access and mobility in the King County 17 open space system by acquiring lands and continuing to
