Dear Councilmember Dembowski,

Attached you will find detailed descriptions of the In Service Training Plan as required by Ordinance 18835, Section 21, Proviso 3.

Implicit Bias training, with Dr. Bryant Marks, a Professor from Morehouse College, is currently underway and runs through the 2019-2020 Biennium. If any member of Council staff would like to attend, please let me know and I will make every attempt to accommodate them.

The second day of our three-day curriculum, which covers de-escalation and Use of Force, will commence once Council accepts our report and lifts the expenditure restriction.

The third-day of training will occur in 2020 and be a continuation of de-escalation, hands on defensive tactics, and other requirements that the Law Enforcement Training and Community Safety Act (I-940) will bring. I would like to note that the Act will likely require 40 hours of training per commissioned deputy. Once we receive additional information we can provide it to you at your request.
