









# 2015 Strategic Climate Action Plan (SCAP)

- SCAP unanimously adopted by Council, November 2015
- > 5-year blueprint for County climate action
- 2019 marks year 4 of implementation
- Comprehensive update to the plan by June 2020

# Getting results: Energy

- Surpassing energy efficiency goals (county operations)
- Certified our first Net Zero Energy building retrofit
- Exceeding goal for Net Zero and Living Buildings
- Working with cities on model codes and incentives



## Getting results: Clean Electricity

- Mapped out actions needed to achieve 90% renewable electricity by 2030
- Partnered with cities and business to secure new renewable electricity option (Green Direct)
- King County enrolling 98% of electricity load, will reduce direct county emissions by 20%

- Continue to focus 98% of new growth in urban areas.
- Nation-leading commitment and investments in Zero Emissions Fleet
- Continued "roll out" of battery buses and planning for new base

# Open space and Healthy Forests

- Developed Land Conservation Initiative
- Tripled pace of investment in land conservation
- Launched first local government forest carbon credit program
- Closing in on 1 million Trees goal
- Forest Health Plan underway

- >Transparency (e.g. Biennial Report)
- ➤ Comprehensive View
- ➤ Concept of "ambitious and achievable"
- Working at both operations and community scales
- ➤ Weaving climate considerations throughout county operations

- Update technical analysis supporting the SCAP
- Co-develop community-driven goals, targets and actions
- Develop new actions that strengthen community resilience




- Population Growth

- Building and Industrial Energy Efficiency




