1.	Transportation	Secure the following in the Transportation Appropriations bill:  1. \$14.25 million for Bus Rapid Transit on the Pacific Highway S.  2. \$5 million for the purchase of Hybrid Buses;  3. \$5 million for the South Park Bridge Replacement Project;  4. \$4 million for the Novelty Hill Road Improvements Project; and  5. \$2 million for the Transit Oriented Development Project.  6. \$2 million for the Vashon Passenger Only Ferry  Support legislation that would supplement the definition of "Bridge" as used in section 650.403 of the federal register to include short span structures whose replacement would be more than 20 feet long. This would allow short-spans to qualify for the federal bridge replacement and rehabilitation program.			
2.	Salmon Recovery	Secure the following in the Energy and Water Appropriations bill:  • \$9.5 million for the Duwamish/Green Ecosystem Restoration Program;  • Funding for Salmon Habitat Restoration Studies, specifically:  • \$400,000 for the Lake Washington/Ship Canal Ecosystem Study;  • \$1.9 million for the Puget Sound Nearshore Ecosystem Restoration Project; and			
		Support \$90 million funding level for the Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Program, which is critical to habitat recovery projects in King County.  Secure \$500,000 to design, implement and maintain a series of on-the-ground restoration projects on private agricultural lands for salmon habitat restoration in the Snoqualmie Watershed through the USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service, Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program.			
3.	Flood Control	Support Tukwila 205 Levee Reconstruction – up to \$32,000,000 in the Energy and Water Appropriations Bill (Army Corps of Engineers):  • Reconstruction of 4.25 miles of levee protecting City of Tukwila, Southcenter businesses and other regionally significant economic centers. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and local governments believe that reconstruction of the Tukwila 205 levee system for conveyance and capacity improvements is in the best interest of the local communities to ensure the long term protection of lives and property. This request is to fully pursue and secure federal funding for reconstruction of the levee system and collaborate with local and state agencies on design and project implementation.

Puget Sound Recovery Initiative	Support Pacific Northwest National Laboratory's efforts to secure funding for Endocrine Disrupting Compounds (EDC) research in partnership with King County on aquatic effects and effective treatment methods.  Support federal designation and funding of the Puget Sound Initiative.  Support King County Wastewater Treatment Division as a pilot for a water quality cap & trade system with USDA and/or EPA.
5.	Wastewater	Secure \$1 million funding under EPA's State Tribal Assistance Grant (STAG) program for construction of Quartermaster Harbor community wastewater treatment facilities.
6.	Workforce Development	Support \$500,000 in the Labor-Health and Human Services-Education Appropriations bill for the Seattle King County Workforce Development Council to integrate workforce training services into other social services currently offered to ex-offenders transitioning back into the community.
7.	Emergency Management	Support federal legislation that provides revenue tools to local governments to fund the new infrastructure needed to provide effective e-911 services resulting from internet service providers offering Voice over Internet Protocol (VOIP). Monitor future activity pertaining to the FCC regulation requiring VoIP to provide e-911 service.

1.	Immigration Reform	Support legislation to allow for a fair and equitable system of earned citizenship for the estimated 11-12 million undocumented aliens currently living and working the United States.
2.	Workforce Training	Support Workforce Investment Act funding for dislocated workers and youth education and training funds. Support funding for the HUD Youthbuild program.
3.	Endangered Species	Oppose any attempts to weaken environmental protections provided by the Endangered Species Act.
		Support any and all efforts to increase funding for salmon habitat restoration.
4	Natural Resources	Adequately fund the State Revolving Fund for water pollution infrastructure improvements at \$1.35 billion.
		Support legislation to create a national trust fund for water and wastewater infrastructure.

Include provisions to provide incentives for local governments to address their impacts on global warming, such as increase use of hybrid fleets and bio-diesel; hydrogen fuel cells and reclaimed water investments at waster water treatment plants, addressing the reduction of vehicle miles traveled by residents, etc.
7.	Renewable Fuels Standard	Support House and Senate bills calling for mandated minimum fuels content for ethanol in gasoline and bio-diesel in diesel.
8.	Flood Control	Support the Green River Flood Control Zone District's request for \$500,000 in the Energy and Water Appropriations bill in Section 205 Continuing Authorities funds for improvements to the Tukwila levee on the lower Green River to protect 500-acre economic development.
		Support the City of North Bend's request for \$200,000 in the Energy and Water Appropriations bill in Section 205 Continuing Authorities funds for flood risk reduction feasibility analysis of levee improvements on the South Fork Snoqualmie River to protect regional economic development.

		Support legislation to broaden allowable Medicaid mental health services following the recommendations of the President's New Freedom Commission on Mental health.
13.	Repeal Institutions for Mental Disease (IMD) Exclusion	Facilities of greater than 16 beds that are primarily devoted to the care of psychiatric patients are deemed to be Institutions for Mental Diseases (IMD). Persons in such a facility do not qualify for Medicaid and no Title XIX funding can be used for their care. The IMD Exclusion impacts over 400 individuals who reside in King County residential facilities. GET MORE INFO
14.	Title III Urban Forestry Program	Support the reauthorization of the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act (P.L. 106-393).
15.	Forest Legacy Program	Support continued funding for this program to set aside working forest lands. It would be useful in achieving the 100,000 acre goal.
16.	Freedom Choice Act	Urging Cognress to enact the Employee Free Choice Act, S. 842 or H.R. 1696
17.	Farm Bill Reauthorization	Support reauthorization of the Farm Bill as a tool to promote food security and access to health foods through the preservation of family farms.
