41 hereby amended to read as follows:

42 ~~((All invoiced f))~~ A. Fees ((shall be)) are due and payable ((on or before the
43 thirtieth day after receipt of an invoice)) at the time of application for service or the due
44 date stated on the department's invoice.

45 B. A late penalty payment equal to one ~~((and one-half))~~ percent of the delinquent
46 unpaid balance, compounded monthly, shall be assessed on ~~((the))~~ any delinquent unpaid
47 balance.

48 C. The department shall charge an insufficient funds charge of twenty-five
49 dollars.

50 SECTION 2. Ordinance 13332, Section 59, as amended and K.C.C. 27.02.080
51 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

52 A. A flat fee ((assessed at the department's current hourly rate)) of two hundred
53 five dollars shall be charged for department staff time associated with all work done in
54 conjunction with the setting, intake~~((, monitoring, inspection,))~~ and release ((and
55 enforcement)) of financial guarantees for development permits. ~~((A minimum of one~~
56 ~~hour's fee shall be charged for intake or release of any guarantee.))~~

57 B. A fee assessed at the department's current hourly rate shall be charged for
58 department staff time associated with all work done in conjunction with the monitoring,
59 inspection and enforcement of financial guarantees for development permits.

60 SECTION 3. Ordinance 13332, Section 13, as amended and K.C.C. 27.02.160
61 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

62 A. The department may collect nonpermit-related fees for services including, but

63 not limited to, making copies, providing letters of zoning certification, notarizing
64 documents, gathering, preparing, and publishing special request reports, and providing
65 publications. The fees shall be at actual cost to the department and shall be collected at
66 the time services are requested. The department shall publish an annual schedule of these
67 fees.

70 C. ~~Insufficient funds charge: twenty-five dollars.~~

71 D.)) Special requests concerning addressing issues that require staff time for
72 research or site visits shall be charged at the department's current hourly rate.

75 A. Except as otherwise provided in subsections B and C of this section, the
76 department's current hourly rate shall be assessed under this title at a rate of one hundred

78 B. Land use permits for agricultural activities on RA-zoned property for which
79 the property owner has a current farm plan developed in conjunction with the King
80 Conservation District or on lands within the agricultural production district shall be

86 D. For purposes of this section, "agricultural building" means a structure, other
87 than a dwelling, that is:

88 1. Located on RA-zoned property for which the property owner has a current
89 farm plan developed in conjunction with the King Conservation District or on lands
90 within the agricultural production district; and

91 2. Used in the operation of the farm for:

92 a. Storage, maintenance or repair of farm machinery and equipment;

93 b. The raising, harvesting and selling of crops;

94 c. The feeding, breeding, management and sale of, or the produce of, livestock,
95 poultry, fur-bearing animals or honeybees;

96 d. Dairying and the sale of dairy products;

97 e. Any other agricultural or horticultural use or animal husbandry, or any
98 combination thereof, including the preparation, storage, processing, or sale of agricultural
99 products raised on the farm for human use and animal use;

100 f. Processing, treatment, packaging, and sale of agricultural products;

101 g. Stabling or training equines; or

102 h. Equine riding lessons and training clinics.

103 SECTION 5. Ordinance 13332, Section 15, as amended, and K.C.C. 27.04.050
104 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

105 "Valuation" means the determination of value made by the building official or the
106 building official's designee. In determining the applicable fee based on valuation,
107 ~~((total))~~ the valuation shall be determined based on current nationally recognized
108 valuation tables, such as R.S. Means cost data publications, Dodge cost data publications

109 or the current valuation data published by the International Conference of Building
110 Officials. In determining the valuation for permit and plan review fees, the valuation
111 includes the total value of all construction work for which the permit is issued, including
112 all finish work, painting, roofing, electrical, plumbing, heating, ventilation and air
113 conditioning, elevators, fire systems and any other permanent fixtures.


