1	AN ORDINANCE relating to Bow Lake transfer station
2	access; authorizing the director of the solid waste division
3	of the department of natural resources and parks to modify
4	access to the county's Bow Lake transfer station for users
5	who have not established monthly accounts, in order to
6	facilitate the efficient and cost-effective construction of a
7	replacement transfer station on the site.

9	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
10	SECTION 1. Findings:
11	A. In accordance with the Solid Waste Transfer and Waste Management Plan,
12	approved by the King County council on December 10, 2007, the solid waste division is
13	actively engaged in planning and implementing construction of a new recycling and
14	transfer station to replace the existing Bow Lake transfer station, located in Tukwila,
15	Washington.

16	B. The King County solid waste division is currently entering into contracts to
17	construct a new facility on a portion of the existing Bow Lake transfer station site and
18	adjacent property.
19	C. K.C.C. 10.25.050.B. establishes regional transfer system policies including
20	RTS-4, which states: "The county should prioritize efficient service to commercial
21	haulers while still providing services for self-haul customers, provided that nothing in
22	this policy permits limiting standard hours of operation at county transfer facilities for
23	self-haul customers without council approval by ordinance."
24	D. The Bow Lake transfer station currently operates twenty-four hours a day,
25	seven days a week for all classes of customers. The construction of the replacement Bow
26	Lake transfer station will take place on the site of the existing transfer station, as well as
27	on adjacent property. Because of site constraints, the full operation of the existing Bow
28	Lake transfer station for all customers at all hours of the day and night would negatively
29	impact construction activities, resulting in increased costs and a delayed opening for the
30	replacement facility.
31	E. The solid waste division has determined that it can keep the existing Bow
32	Lake transfer station open during construction for the majority of its tonnage while
33	minimizing construction impacts by modifying access for self-haul customers who have
34	not established monthly accounts for solid waste disposal. This change will maximize
35	existing disposal operations while facilitating the efficient and cost-effective construction
36	of the replacement transfer station.

SECTION 2. With ten days' prior notice provided by signs posted at the Bow Lake transfer station and in a news release distributed to local media, the director of the

solid waste division may limit access to the Bow Lake transfer station to specified hours
for self-haul customers who have not established monthly accounts with the county. This
modified access is authorized only during the period of construction of the replacement
facility.

Ordinance 16444 was introduced on 3/16/2009 and passed by the Metropolitan King
County Council on 4/6/2009, by the following vote:
