- Biannual ferry user data service conducted by the Washington Transportation Commission
- Route input for WSF's every-decade Long Range Plan
- · Terminal and vessel passenger area concerns, and
- Regional issues relevant to state ferry service.

According to state law, there are three members of the Vashon Ferry Advisory Committee:

- Each member shall reside within the vicinity of the Vashon Island ferry terminal
- At least one person appointed shall be a representative of an established ferry user group or of frequent users of the ferry system, and
- Not more than two members of the Vashon Island Ferry Advisory Committee may be from the same political party at the time of their appointment.

Individuals appointed to serve on a board or commission that is overseen by an agency independent of King County government (such as the Vashon Island Ferry Advisory Committee) are exempt from King County financial disclosure filing requirements. However, FACs are subject to the Washington State Open Public Meeting Act.

I currently live and work on Vashon Island but use the ferry often (once/week) to visit family and friends in Seattle and/or Tacoma to access medical and other retail services.

Please explain why you feel you are the most qualified candidate for this appointment.

I am the most qualified candidate for this appointment for the following reasons:

- As an 8+ year resident of Vashon Island, I have personal knowledge of how the ferry system presents both benefits and burdens to the communities it serves.
- I currently serve in a public facing role on the island as Executive Director of the Vashon Food Bank. I have plenty of connections and the food bank has a great reputation as connected island institution.
- My time in the Evans MPA program familiarized me with the complexities of public service delivery in an environment with multiple, and often conflicting, variables at play. I have experience with qualitative and quantitative data analysis and a variety of stakeholder engagement strategies.
- During my time at Evans I served in two different capacities as a paid research assistant for WSF projects. I worked with faculty from the Evans School to analyze ticketing and loading procedures at the Fauntleroy Ferry Terminal and continued on to work with UW's TRAC on a deeper analysis of what it would take to integrate Good to Go more effectively into WSF's fare collection system. In phase one of the project, I interviewed and engaged directly with members of all three of the Triangle Route FACs and the since disbanded (?) Triangle Task Force.
