NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held before the Metropolitan King County Council on Tuesday, November 17th, 2020 at 1:00 p.m. to consider adoption of Proposed Ordinance No. 2020-0306, which will adopt the 2020-2021 King County Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The CIP becomes the capital facilities component of the King County Comprehensive Plan and is adopted as an amendment to the King County Comprehensive Plan. The 2021-2026 King County CIP, as adopted by the County Comprehensive Plan. The 2021-2026 King County CIP, as adopted by the County Control, will satisfy the Growth Management Act requirement to provide a six-year plan that will finance capital facilities within projected funding capacities and clearly identify sources of public money for those capital facilities. The public hearing is planned to either be held at the King County Courthouse, 516 3rd Avenue, Room 1001, Seattle, Washington; or the hearing may be required to be held remotely to comply with the Washinston State Governor's Declaration on this public hearing, including how to submit public testimony and attend the meeting, will be posted on the Council's website ahead of the hearing.

SUMMARY
The CIP budget for the 2021-2022 biennium is \$1.360 billion. Of the \$1.360 billion proposed to be budgeted for 2021-2022, \$39.7 million is proposed for the King County International Airport capital program, \$302.9 million for the Parks and Conservation Futures capital programs, \$109.6 million for county facilities and information technology capital programs, \$46.5 million for the county roads capital program, \$40.7 million for the solid waste capital programs, \$140.7 million for the solid waste capital programs, \$95.6 million for the Transit capital programs, and \$553.2 million is proposed for the Wastewater Treatment capital program.
