Dear Councilmember Balducci:

This letter transmits a proposed motion that, if enacted, would authorize the King County Executive to accept two conservation easement donations of approximately 23.5 acres near Shadow Lake, north of Covington, appraised at one hundred sixty-seven thousand and five hundred dollars, for fish and wildlife habitat conservation purposes.

The proposed motion would protect land in the rural area and permanently protect fish and wildlife habitat, including a 5,000-year-old peat bog that offers habitat to numerous protected species and which drains to salmon-bearing streams. The proposal will also expand existing land protection in this area, which currently totals over 70 acres. Two maps showing the location of the properties are attached.

Approval of this proposed legislation supports the King County Strategic Plan goal of Healthy Environment by preserving open space and rural character while addressing climate change through the preservation of healthy forests, permanent conservation of fish and wildlife habitat, and the protection of land in the rural area. It also supports the mission of the Department of Natural Resources and Parks by protecting natural ecosystems that benefit the people of King County.

The proposed motion also furthers the Strategic Climate Action Plan goal of protecting forest lands and the multiple benefits forests provide, including supporting greenhouse gas reduction efforts through carbon sequestration and increasing forest canopy in urban and rural areas of the county.

This proposed property donation is consistent with the King County Open Space Plan, which calls for the preservation of open space properties that provide natural resource protection and helps implement the Land Conservation Initiative which seeks to protect remaining high conservation value lands within King County by 2050.
