1 **AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED ORDINANCE 2021-0155, VERSION 2**

2 On page 32, after line 715, insert:

3 "SECTION 19. Ordinance 19210, Section 69, as amended, is hereby amended as
4 follows:

5 MENTAL ILLNESS AND DRUG DEPENDENCY FUND - From the mental
6 illness and drug dependency fund there is hereby disappropriated from:

7 Mental illness and drug dependency fund (\$330,000)

8 SECTION 20. The council directs that section 19 of this ordinance takes effect
9 before section 21 of this ordinance.

10 SECTION 21. Ordinance 19210, Section 69, as amended, is hereby amended as
11 follows:

12 MENTAL ILLNESS AND DRUG DEPENDENCY FUND - From the mental
13 illness and drug dependency fund there is hereby appropriated to:

14 Mental illness and drug dependency fund \$500,000

15 ER1 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

16 Of this appropriation, \$170,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
17 support an organization that serves individuals who have been traumatized by
18 homelessness, substance use disorder, poverty and other behavioral health challenges

19 based on a peer-service delivery model in the city of Seattle, to provide behavioral health
20 services for which demand has increased as a result of increase in severity and number of
21 behavioral health symptoms experienced by people across the county due to the COVID-
22 19 pandemic.

23 ER2 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

24 Of this appropriation, \$330,000 of mental illness drug dependency levy revenue
25 shall be expended or encumbered solely to support the Recovery Café.

26 P1 PROVIDED THAT:

27 Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
28 executive transmits a report on the provision of community-based substance use disorder
29 services and mental health services in the rural unincorporated area of King County.

30 The report shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

31 A. A needs assessment of community-based substance use disorder services and
32 mental health services in the rural unincorporated areas of King County including
33 detailed information about: (1) the providers currently providing substance use disorder
34 services and mental health services in the rural unincorporated area and the geographic
35 locations of those existing providers; (2) any gaps in substance use disorder services and
36 mental health services in the rural unincorporated area; and (3) an assessment of
37 resources needed to fill those gaps;

38 B. The identification and description of opportunities to leverage services located
39 elsewhere in the county, including in Seattle, Renton and Tukwila, to meet the needs of
40 rural unincorporated King County, including the identification of innovative delivery
41 models such as, but not limited to, telehealth, hub and spoke or mobile services to expand

42 access to needed services in rural areas; and

43 C. A description of current or past community outreach and engagement with
44 individuals and addiction recovery and mental health service providers in the rural
45 unincorporated area of King County regarding service provision, the content of the
46 engagement with those individuals and service providers, what steps were taken to
47 address any gaps if any that have been identified and what barriers exist to addressing
48 those gaps.

49 The executive should electronically file the report required by this proviso no later
50 than September 1, 2021, with the clerk of the council, who shall retain an electronic copy
51 and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers, the council chief of staff and the
52 lead staff for the community, health and housing committee, or its successor."

53 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any internal references
54 accordingly.

62 ***The amendment would also make a technical amendment to add an Expenditure***
63 ***Restriction for an already appropriated \$330,000 of MIDD levy revenues for the***

64 *Recovery Café. The appropriation was included in the biennial budget and was*
65 *intended to be used for the Recovery Café.*
