Dear Councilmember Balducci:

The enclosed proposed supplemental appropriation Ordinance, if enacted, will provide funding to the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) division within the Department of Public Health to implement the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) with the International Association of Fire Fighters, Local 2595 (IAFF) covering Mobile Intensive Care Paramedics and Paramedic Supervisors in the Department of Public Health for the contractual period of January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2023.

This proposed supplemental provides \$1,422,000 to cover General Wage Increases (GWI) in 2021, 2022, and 2023 using the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) for Seattle-Tacoma-Bellevue (June to June) plus 1 percent for each year of the agreement. The wage adjustments are based on historical wage adjustments for the bargaining unit, the external market, and budget.

Adoption of this proposed Ordinance will enable King County to provide bargained for wages, hours, and working conditions to employees who provide paramedic services in our community. The negotiated CBA covers approximately 80 King County Medic One (KCM1) employees, including paramedics, paramedic supervisors, and paramedic interns. KCM1 provides service locations at nine medic stations.

The negotiated CBA was reached pursuant to good faith collective bargaining between King County and the IAFF. It has been ratified by the bargaining unit. The CBA contains updates to improve operational efficiency, adopting several King County standards such as vacation accrual for 40-hour employees and donated leave. Operational efficiencies include streamlined process for how unexpected staffing vacancies are filled.

Adoption of this proposed Ordinance advances the King County Strategic Plan goal of efficient, accountable regional and local government and its objective to deliver consistent, responsive, equitable, high-quality services to residents, cities, and districts.
