1	An ORDINANCE related to the employee giving program;
2	and amending Ordinance 15558, Section 2, as amended,
3	and K.C.C. 3.12.222.
4	STATEMENT OF FACTS
5	A. On February 29, 2020, the governor declared a state of emergency in
6	response to cases of COVID-19 in Washington state.
7	B. On March 1, 2020, the county executive signed a proclamation of
8	emergency in King County to ensure the immediate preservation of public
9	health and to relieve the loss, hardship and suffering of county residents.
10	C. As of May 25, 2021, more than 33 million cases of COVID-19 have
11	been confirmed, resulting in at least 590,000 deaths in the United States.
12	D. As of May 25, 2021, more than 167 million cases of COVID-19 have
13	been confirmed, resulting in at least 3.4 million deaths globally.
14	E. The global pandemic caused by the novel coronavirus continues to
15	disproportionately impact certain communities, regions and countries
16	throughout the world. For example, India is currently the global epicenter
17	of the pandemic and global relief efforts are now focused there.
18	F. Although many King County residents and employees have contributed
19	to COVID-19 relief efforts through personal donations, many are seeking
20	alternative methods for contributing to ongoing international relief efforts.

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21	G. K.C.C. 3.12.222 provides a process for county employees to donate
22	accrued vacation or accumulated compensatory hours for natural disaster
23	relief efforts, however, this process does not explicitly cover donations for
24	the purpose of supporting epidemic relief efforts, including those on a
25	pandemic scale.
26	H. King County has consistently encouraged contributions to natural
27	disaster relief efforts through its existing employee giving program and
28	should facilitate employee contributions to COVID-19 relief efforts
29	specifically and future epidemic relief efforts in general.
30	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
31	SECTION 1. Ordinance 15558, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 3.12.222 are
32	hereby amended to read as follows:
33	A. Annually, from the first business day in October through the last business day
34	in November, an employee eligible for comprehensive leave benefits may sign a written
35	authorization subject to approval by the employee's department director to convert
36	accrued vacation or accumulated compensatory hours, or both, into cash to benefit up to
37	three nonprofit organizations participating in the King County employee annual drive in
38	accordance with K.C.C. chapter 3.36, of the employee's choice.
39	B. Notwithstanding K.C.C. 3.12.190, an employee eligible for comprehensive
40	leave benefits may convert accrued vacation or accumulated compensatory hours, or
41	both, into cash to benefit ((natural)) emergency or disaster relief efforts. Upon the
42	occurrence of ((a natural)) an emergency or disaster, such as fire, flood, explosion, storm,
43	earthquake or epidemic, that results in the loss of either life or property, or both, and with

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44	the exception of the employee annual drive-related period designated under subsection A.		
45	of this section, the executive may authorize a forty-five-day opportunity for employees		
46	eligible for comprehensive leave benefits to sign a written authorization to convert		
47	accrued vacation or accumulated compensatory hours, or both, into cash to benefit up to		
48	three nonprofit organizations designated by the executive. The employee's written		
49	authorization is subject to approval by the employee's department director. The		
50	designated nonprofit organization must be a King County employee annual drive		
51	participant in accordance with K.C.C. chapter 3.36. This section shall be administered in		
52	accordance with K.C.C. chapter 3.36.		
53	C. The hours converted under subsection A. or B. of this section must be in full-		
54	hour increments. The employee's donation must be a minimum of four hours and no		
55	more than forty hours per calendar year with the exception of the conditions described in		
56	subsection D. of this section.		
57	D. An employee eligible for comprehensive leave benefits who earned excess		
58	vacation leave or compensatory hours, or both, beyond the amount that may be carried		
59	over into the next fiscal year may donate greater than forty hours under subsection A. or		
60	B. of this section with approval from the employee's department director.		
61	E. All King County ((benefit eligible)) employees eligible for comprehensive		
62	leave benefits may donate in accordance with this section voluntarily.		
63	F. The finance and business operations division shall value the hours donated		
64	under this section based on the regular hourly rate of the employee in effect at the time		
65	the approved conversion authorization is processed. The finance and business operations		
66	division shall process leave donations authorized under subsection A. of this section		

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67	within the first two full weeks in December. The finance and business operations	
68	division shall process leave donations authorized under subsection B. of this section	
69	within the first two full weeks after the forty-five-day period designated in accordance	
70	with subsection B. of this section.	
71	G. The net cash value of the accrued vacation or compensatory hours, or both,	
72	after all mandatory withholdings, including, but not limited to, withholding in accordance	
73	with retirement plans, federal income tax and the Federal Insurance Contributions Act,	

- have been deducted must be distributed by the finance and business operations division to
- 75 the designated nonprofit organization or organizations.
