The Board took a unanimous vote to restrict the sale and availability of electronic smoking devices in King County to people who are under the age of 18. The Board also prohibited the distribution of free electronic smoking devices and their use in places where smoking is prohibited by law.

*Mr.* Phillips reported on the Sound Transit Board. The Board adopted the Sound Transit budget and will move forward with the ST2 mass transit expansion. The Board received a briefing on the north corridor transit project alternatives analysis, looking at potential light rail alignments between Northgate and Lynnwood.

## First Reading and Referral of Ordinances

#### 24. Proposed Ordinance No. 2011-0018

AN ORDINANCE providing for the submission to the qualified electors of King County at a special election to be held in King County on August 16, 2011, of a proposition to provide regional health and human services to residents of King County by renewing authorization of the veterans and human services property tax levy in excess of the levy limitation contained in chapter 84.55 RCW, for a consecutive six year period at a rate of not more than \$0.05 per one thousand dollars of assessed valuation, for the purpose of providing funding to enable the provision of health and human services such as affordable and supportive housing, mental health counseling, substance abuse prevention and treatment, employment assistance and other essential regional health and human services for residents of King County and establishing county citizen oversight boards to review and report on expenditures of levy proceeds, contingent on voter approval of the levy.

This matter had its first reading and was a dual referral first to the Regional Policy Committee and then to the Budget and Fiscal Management Committee. This is a nonmandatory referral to the Regional Policy Committee under King County Charter 270.30 and KCC 1.24.0651 as an issue that is not a countywide policy or plan but would benefit from interjurisdictional discussion.

## 25. Proposed Ordinance No. 2011-0019

AN ORDINANCE providing for the submission to the qualified electors of King County at a special election to be held in King County on November 8, 2011, of a proposition to provide regional health and human services to residents of King County by renewing authorization of the veterans and human services property tax levy in excess of the levy limitation contained in chapter 84.55 RCW, for a consecutive six year period at a rate of not more than \$0.05 per one thousand dollars of assessed valuation, for the purpose of providing funding to enable the provision of health and human services such as affordable and supportive housing, mental health counseling, substance abuse prevention and treatment, employment assistance and other essential regional health and human services for residents of King County and establishing county citizen oversight boards to review and report on expenditures of levy proceeds, contingent on voter approval of the levy.

This matter had its first reading and was a dual referral first to the Regional Policy Committee and then to the Budget and Fiscal Management Committee. This is a nonmandatory referral to the Regional Policy Committee under King County Charter 270.30 and KCC 1.24.0651 as an issue that is not a countywide policy or plan but would benefit from interjurisdictional discussion.
