The noise mitigation report recommends additional study of pedestrian crossovers, safety bell decibel levels, rail grinding techniques and noise barriers.

Councilmember Lambert reported on the Eastside Transportation Partnership meeting. The committee was briefed on the King County Road Service Strategic Plan and service updates for Metro Transit. They also discussed the Governor's Connecting Washington Task Force.

Councilmember Lambert briefed the Council on the Washington State Association of Counties general meeting. Brian Baird, former U.S. Representative for Washington's 3rd congressional district, discussed his new book regarding how people can be more efficient in government.

Other Business

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The Chair recessed the meeting into Executive Session, under RCW 42.30.140, at 2:20 p.m. to discuss with legal counsel collective bargaining strategy and negotiations. The Chair reconvened the meeting at 3:06 p.m.
