Mr. Phillips reported on the Sound Transit Capital Committee. The members received updates on the east link and south link light rail expansion projects.

Ms. Lambert commented on the recent death of the Mt. Rainier forest ranger, and wanted to show appreciation for the efforts of the rescue workers who found the snowshoer on Mt. Rainier who recently got lost.
