Mr. Phillips reported on the Sound Transit Capital Committee. He indicated the staff briefed the committee on the ongoing work between the city of Bellevue and Sound Transit, to identify cost savings for the east link light rail project. Staff also gave an overview of the 2013 budget.

Ms. Hague reported on the Eastside Transportation Partnership. A presentation was given by Sound Transit regarding proposed service changes that will cause additional revenue being sought for not only King County Metro, but also the Roads Division.

Other Business

Mr. Phillips commented on the passing of former Democratic state Senate Majority Leader Sid Snyder. *Mr.* von Reichbauer and *Ms.* Patterson also made comments. *Mr.* Phillips requested a moment of silence.

Ms. Lambert mentioned cyber security and the cyber security pledge which is available on line to employees and to citizens.
