11. Proposed Ordinance No. 2013-0481

AN ORDINANCE approving a development agreement between King County and BD Village Partners, LP, relating to a seventy-seven-lot subdivision adjacent to the city of Black Diamond, a regional stormwater facility and transfer to King County of open space lands.

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12. Proposed Motion No. 2013-0253

A MOTION confirming the executive's appointment of Beverly Heyden, who resides in council district six, to the King County advisory council on aging and disability services.

13. Proposed Motion No. 2013-0456

A MOTION acknowledging receipt of a report regarding human trafficking in King County in compliance with the 2013 Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 17476, Section 57, Proviso P1; and authorizing the release of \$125,000 to the sheriff's office and the release of \$125,000 to the Seattle-King County department of public health.

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Sponsors: Ms. Lambert

This matter had its first reading and was referred to the Law, Justice, Health and Human Services Committee.

14. Proposed Motion No. 2013-0477

A MOTION acknowledging receipt of a report on combined sewer overflow control project sequencing in accordance with the 2013 Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 17476, Section 132, wastewater treatment capital improvement, Proviso P1; and authorizing the release of \$500,000 for the combined sewer overflow comprehensive planning and reporting program.

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Sponsors: Mr. Phillips

This is a dual referral first to the Regional Water Quality Committee and then to the Transportation, Economy and Environment Committee.

This matter had its first reading and was referred to the Regional Transit Committee.

16. <u>Reports on Special and Outside Committees</u>

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The Council was recessed at 11:58 a.m. The Chair reconvened the meeting at 2:32 p.m.

Ms. Hague reported on the Eastside Transportation Partnership meeting. The members discussed Metro transit cuts, including a discussion of the State Legislature actions. The members heard a report on the status of rural roads and snow plowing. Ms. Lambert also commented on the meeting, and indicated the support from Eastside individuals regarding transportation needs was very reinforcing.

Mr. Phillips briefed the Council on the Cedar River Council and his attendance at the annual meeting, which was co-hosted by King County, the Flood Control District and Cedar River Council. He indicated that it was an excellent opportunity to review the work of the citizens and agencies that protect and restore the Cedar River.
