33. Reports on Special and Outside Committees

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Councilmember Lambert reported on the Committee to End Homelessness. The committee has reached its ten year lifespan and has been dissolved. A new coalition has been formed to continue the work and will be appointing a new board soon. Councilmember Lambert indicated that Seattle is one of the top five cities for amount of affordable housing available. The committee created 6,000 new housing units in the ten years of its existence. Councilmember Lambert discussed the importance of rapid rehousing to help people achieve stability quickly. The region is a national leader in rapid rehousing.

Councilmember Dunn reported on the Teanaway Community Forest Management Plan Celebration. Teanaway Community Forest is the first community forest in Washington and consists of 51,000 acres. The State of Washington created a new self-sustaining model to manage the land with a goal of making sure instream flows of the Yakima River are maintained for long term preservation. A plan signing and celebration occurred on June 25, 2015.

Councilmember Phillips provided an update on the Washington State legislative session. He indicated that Governor Inslee signed a balanced operating budget, a transportation revenue proposal bill passed and a cultural access bill passed.

AN ORDINANCE providing for the submission to the qualified electors of King County at a special election to be held in King County on November 3, 2015, a proposition to add a new Section 265 to the King County Charter, establishing a charter-based civilian office of law enforcement oversight to investigate complaints about law enforcement conduct and the use of force by the King County sheriff and the department of public safety, providing the office with appropriate authority to carry out its duties and establishing a charter-based citizen advisory committee on law enforcement oversight; and appointing a committee to write the voters pamphlet statement for the November 3, 2015, special election.
