5. Metropolitan Water Pollution Abatement Advisory Committee

Pam Carter, Chair, Metropolitan Water Pollution Abatement Advisory Committee (MWPAAC), reported that the committee received an update on the study and recommendations to improve the electrical reliability at the West Point Treatment Plant. The Wastewater Treatment Division provided a presentation to MWPAAC on the nutrient discharges issue. MWPAAC also has been having a series of briefings on rate setting and Asset Management.

6. <u>Director's Report-Mark Isaacson, Director, Wastewater Treatment</u> Division

Mark Isaacson, Director, Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD), reported that the topics on today's agenda are very important because both are major drivers in WTD's clean water plan.

As we enter into the fall wet weather season, two critical issues are power reliability and the safety of the staff. Extra precautions are being taken to keep staff safe during the pandemic. Also, a contingency plan has been created for how to respond if the West Seattle Bridge fails. And lastly, the director noted that during the recent major rain event, all facilities operated as intended.
