Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:50 p.m.

Roll Call

1. Approval of Minutes of January 17, 2006

Mr. von Reichbauer moved to approve the minutes of January 17, 2006 meeting as presented. Seeing no objection, the Chair so ordered.

2. <u>Reports on Special and Outside Committees</u>

Ms. Patterson briefed the Council on the South County Area Transportation Board. Ms. Patterson was encouraged with the increase in Metro bus service to Auburn and SeaTac. She praised Metro for its extensive outreach in South King County.

Ms. Patterson reported on the Board of Health meeting. Ms. Patterson summarized that the countywide analysis of health indicator findings indicate that we are doing quite well. The findings included an increase in hospitalization resulting from automobile accidents, an increase in academic achievement by our youth, a decrease in infant mortality, a decrease in teen pregnancies, a decrease in tobacco and alcohol use by adults and youth and increase in air quality. Other notable findings included declining affordable housing, how many citizens have access to livable wages in King County, an increase of children living in poverty, an increase in income inequality, an increase in overweight individuals and a decrease in physical activity, a decrease of individuals with health insurance and an increase of individuals experiencing stress. The Board pledged to build policies, push countywide and civic agendas to track progress and redesign communication strategies. The Board also discussed public health standards in relation to the West Nile Virus, healthcare for the homeless, child health prevention collaborative, and an alarming increase in HIV Aids pool. The Board stated that it would seek federal and state government to provide adequate resources and pursue reducing risking behavior.
