Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:49 p.m.

Roll Call

Presentation of a Recognition to the Seattle Seahawks for an Outstanding Season

Mr. von Reichbauer introduced Mike Flood, Vice President of Community Relations, Tim Ruskell, President of Football Operations and Tod Leiweke, Chief Executive Officer and made introductory remarks. Mr. Phillips read the recognition to the Seattle Seahawks for an Outstanding Season. Mr. Leiweke and Mr. Ruskell spoke and thanked the Council.

Presentation of a Recognition to Galvin Flying Services on its 75th Anniversary

Mr. Constantine introduced Peter Anderson, President and Chief Executive Officer, his wife Sarah and son James. Mr. Constantine made introductory remarks, read the recognition and invited all in attendance for Galvin Flying Services to participate in a group photo.

3. Reports on Special and Outside Committees

Ms. Patterson briefed the Council on the Puget Sound Regional Council Transportation Policy Board. The Board received a briefing from Washington State Department of Transportation regarding the progress of studying the most dangerous and congested corridors. The department shared the plans they will use to address safety, mobility and environmental issues. The Board reviewed the outcome of the 2006 Legislative Session which ended March 8th. Ms. Patterson noted the Legislature has mandated a ballot measure between RTID and Sound Transit in November 2007.

Ms. Hague reported on the Eastside Transportation Partnership. The Partnership was briefed on the Legislative Session by Representative Fred Jarrett and Charlie Howard. The Board discussed RTID/RTA ballot measure, legislation linking 520 to the viaduct and the \$250,000 mitigation to the City of Seattle and expanding the tolling authority to impact regional and local arterials. Ms. Hague mentioned that the city of Duvall is interested in membership.
